MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING APRIL 20, 1995 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

After calling the meeting to order, Chairman Manning welcomed every one to the meeting, and asked the Clerk for a roll call. All Board members answered present.

An Order granting the petitioner's motion to further stay the proceedings for 90 days, directing the petitioner to file a status report on or before July 13, 1995 indicating the status of its NPDES permit, whether additional time will be required or whether it will be necessary to proceed with the rulemaking, and requesting the petitioner to file the appropriate motions withdrawing R81-19 and PCB 85-95 in the event the permit is issued sooner than anticipated, was adopted in R81-19, Proposed Site-Specific Water Pollution Rules and Regulations Applicable to Citizens Utilities Company of Illinois' Discharge to Lily Cache Creek, by a vote of 6-0. R.C. Flemal abstained. (CAM)

Chairman Manning reconvened the meeting at 3:25 p.m. All Board members were present except E. Dunham who was absent due a prior commitment.




