

MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING JULY 7, 1995 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

After calling the meeting to order, Chairman Manning asked the Clerk for a roll call and all Board Members answered present.

Minutes of the June 15, 1995 Regular Board Meeting were approved by a vote of 6-0. J. Yi abstained.

Minutes of the June 22, 1995 Process Meeting were approved by a vote of 6-0. G. Tanner Girard abstained.

Minutes of the June 29, 1995 Process Meeting were approved by a vote of 4-0. R.C. Flemal, G. Tanner Girard, and C.A. Manning abstained.

In R95-2, Exemptions from the Definition of VOM, USEPA Recommended Policy Amendments (July 1, 1994 through December 31, 1994), an Adopted Rule, Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (GTG)

In R95-12, Clean Fuel Fleet Program: Proposed 35 Ill. Adm. Code 241, a Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JY)

In R95-16, Exemptions from the Definition of VOM, USEPA Recommended Policy Amendments (January 1, 1995 through June 30, 1995), a Proposal for Public Comment, Proposed Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (GTG)

Adm. Code Part 304.105 (Ammonia Nitrogen), by a vote of 7-0. (JY)



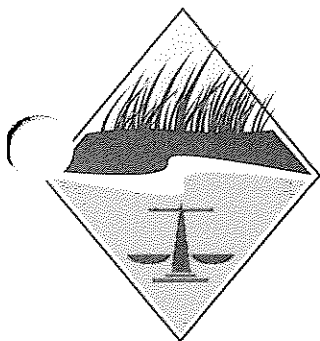

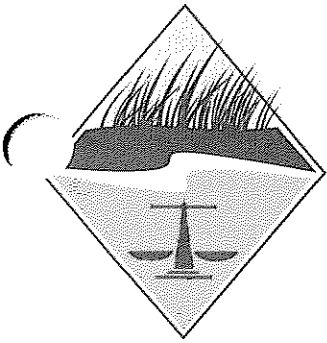
