#### MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING JUNE 20, 1996 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS - 10:30 A.M.

After calling the meeting to order, Chairman Manning welcomed members of the public and staff to the meeting. Thereafter, the Clerk was asked for a roll call and all Board Members answered present except for J. Yi who was on vacation.




