All Board Members were present.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #90-194, Village of Seneca, by a vote of 5-2. Messrs. J. Dumelle and B. Forcade dissented. (JCM)

A Default Order was adopted in this Administrative Citation by a vote of 7-0: #AC 90-95, Johnson Blackwell.

Jurca, however, may file an amicus curiae brief. The vote was 7-0. (BF)
