MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 26, 1991 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #91-60, People of the State of Illinois v. Thomas Steel, by a vote of 5-2. Messrs. J. Dumelle and J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (JCM)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #91-88, County of Lake, by a vote of 6-1. B. Forcade dissented and J. Dumelle concurred. (RCF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in ##91-89, -90, Citizens for Controlled Landfills and YMCA of Southwest Illinois, by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #91-96, The Ensign Bickford Company, by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

In R91-1, RCRA Update, USEPA Regulations (July 1, 1990 through December 31, 1990), a post-adoption Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

In R91-6, PM₁₀ Portland Cement and Quarries, an Adopted Rule, Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

An Order determining that an Economic Impact Study need not be prepared at this time, was adopted in R91-18, Repeal of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 809, Subpart I: Hazardous (Infectious) Hospital Waste, by a vote of 7-0. (RCF)

Agency motion for leave to file Brief Instanter in #AC 89-215, Omer Thomas, will be taken with the case-in-chief.

An Order denying a joint motion for continuance and advising the parties that failure to complete all scheduled hearings by November 15, 1991 will subject the matter to dismissal for want of prosecution, was adopted in #88-98, IBP, Inc., by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

An Order remanding the matter to the Agency and closing the docket was adopted in #88-175, Jefferson Smurfit, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Agency motion to file Post-Hearing Brief Instanter was granted in #89-106, D & B Refuse Service, by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

An Order directing the parties to file the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement by October 28, 1991 and directing the Hearing Officer to set the matter for hearing on the merits within 30 days of October 28, 1991 and to conclude all such hearings no later than December 1, 1991 if the parties fail to do so, was adopted in #90-60, Allied-Hastings Barrel, by a vote of 7-0. (JCM)

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An Order directing the parties to file the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement by October 28, 1991 and directing the Hearing Officer to set the matter for hearing on the merits within 30 days of October 28, 1991 if the parties fail to do so, was adopted in #90-124, Rock Valley Oil & Chemical, by a vote of 7-0. (JCM)

Petitioner's motion to voluntarily dismiss was granted in #90-188, American Steel & Wire, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion for reconsideration was granted and upon reconsideration the Board affirmed its July 25, 1991 Order dismissing Petitioner's permit appeal in #91-110, Indian Refining Limited Partnership, by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

An Order directing the Clerk of the Board to publish the required newspaper notice that the parties have requested relief from hearing pursuant to Section 31(a)(2) of the Environmental Protection Act as enacted in Public Act 87-1034 effective August 13, 1991, and advising the parties that the Board will reserve ruling on its request after the statutory 21 day notice has passed, was adopted in #91-151, People of the State of Illinois v. United States Department of the Navy, by a vote of 7-0. (JCM)

Agency motion to extend time in which to file its Recommendation was granted until February 1, 1992 in #91-160, General Motors, by a vote of 7-0. (JCM)

Agency motion to extend time in which to file its Recommendation was granted until January 1, 1992 in #91-161, Riverside Laboratories, by a vote of 7-0. (JCM)

By a vote of 7-0, Agency motion to extend the time in which to file its Recommendation was denied since the decision deadline had not been waived. However, in the event a further waiver is received, the Hearing Officer was authorized to grant an extension of the time for filing of the Agency's Recommendation provided that it is received no later than the 90th day prior to the Board's decision deadline in #91-162, Minnesota Mining & Manufacturing Company. (JCM)

Chairman Marlin presented a draft Proposed Rule, Second First Notice, Opinion and Order in R90-1, Toxic Air Contaminants List. Motion to amend by J. Theodore Meyer, seconded by J. Dumelle, failed to carry by a vote of 3-4 with J. Dumelle, B. Forcade and J. Theodore Meyer for it and J. Anderson, R. Flemal, J. Marlin and M. Nardulli against it. The Proposed Rule, Second First Notice, Opinion and Order was then adopted by a vote of 7-0. Messrs. J. Dumelle and B. Forcade concurred. (JCM)

In R90-20, Diesel Vehicle Exhaust Opacity Limits, an Order determining that an Economic Impact Study need not be prepared, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

Agency motion to dismiss or, in the alternative, for summary judgment in #90-31, R. Lavin & Sons, was ordered held to October 10, 1991 for possible consideration.

Complainant's motion for additional relief in #90-108, Joseph and Pamela Stratton, was ordered held to October 10, 1991 for possible consideration.
