# MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING MARCH 14, 1991 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present. Chairman Marlin called the meeting to order and recognized Bonnie Meyer, who informed the Board that she will be assuming other duties in the Department of Energy and Natural Resources. Ms. Meyer then introduced William A. Denham who will assume her responsibilities as coordinator of the Economic Impact Assessment Program.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #AC 89-156(B), John Gordon, by a vote of 5-1. J. Theodore Meyer dissented and J. Dumelle abstained. (BF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-205, Vito Zivoli, by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

J. Dumelle presented a draft Opinion and Order in #90-177, A.K.A. Land. An alternate Opinion and Order by J. Anderson, seconded by R. Flemal, carried by a vote of 4-3 with J. Anderson, R. Flemal, J. Marlin and J. Theodore Meyer for it and J. Dumelle, B. Forcade and M. Nardulli against it. The alternate Opinion and Order was then adopted by a vote of 4-3. Messrs. J. Dumelle, B. Forcade and M. Nardulli dissented. (JA)

In R90-9(A & B), Used and Waste Tire Regulations, a Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JCM)

In R90-23, General Motors, Corporation, an EcIS Determination Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

In R90-25, Utility Industry Amendments to the Landfill Regulations, a Proposed Rule, First Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

Default Orders were adopted in these Administrative Citations by a vote of 7-0: ##91-1, Everett Allen; 91-2, Everett Allen; 91-3, Lincoln/Logan Landfill.

Agency motion to withdraw administrative citation, dismiss action and vacate October 11, 1990 Order was granted in #AC 90-76, Johnson Blackwell, by a vote of 7-0. (JCM)

Agency motion to amend administrative citation and correct January 24, 1991 Board Order was granted in #AC 90-95, Johnson Blackwell, by a vote of 7-0. (JCM)

By a vote of 7-0, the parties in #89-94, Reichhold Chemicals, were ordered to file a status report no later than May 14, 1991, that shall inform the Board of the present status of the proceeding and specifically identify what future action, if any,

will be necessary. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to withdraw was granted in #90-86, Container Corporation, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to strike the Agency's amended denial statement in #90-173, Earl R. Bradd, will be taken with the case-in-chief.

Agency motion for leave to file variance recommendation instanter was granted in #90-227, DMI, Inc., by a vote of 7-0. (JCM)

Petitioner's motion for reconsideration of a February 7, 1991 Board Order was denied in #91-1, Alton Community Unit School District, by a vote of 6-0. J. Dumelle abstained. (MN)

By a vote of 7-0, Petitioner's request for oral argument and motion for leave to file a reply instanter was denied. Petitioner's motion for reconsideration of a February 7, 1991 Board Order was granted and upon reconsideration the Board affirmed its decision to grant intervenor status to the People of Will County in #91-7, Land and Lakes Company.
