### MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING MARCH 7, 1985 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present save Mr. Nega who was ill and Mr. Dumelle who was attending official business in Springfield during the morning session of the meeting.

Mrs. Anderson called the meeting to order and introduced three members of the Board's Scientific Technical Support Staff (Dr. Gilbert Zemansky, Dr. Frank DePaul, and Richard DiMambro).

An Order was adopted in #84-162, Hoesman, by a vote of 5-0.

An Order was adopted in #83-58, Caterpillar, by a vote of 5-0; Mr. Forcade concurred. Mr. Dumelle will prepare it.

Motion for extension of time was granted in #84-95, -96, -97, -99, -100, -101, -102, -103, -104, Continental Grain, by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.
