MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING JANUARY 23, 1997 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS - 10:30 A.M.

After calling the meeting to order, Chairman Manning welcomed members of the public and staff to the meeting. Thereafter, the Clerk was asked for a roll call and all Board Members answered present.

Minutes of the January 9, 1997 Board Meeting were approved by a vote of 6-0. Chairman Manning abstained.

In R97-13, Emissions Reduction Market Systems Adoption of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 205 and Amendment of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 106, a motion to file pre-filed questions instanter, was disposed of by the hearing officer at the hearing in the matter.

In R97-24, 9% ROP Plan Control Measures for VOM Emissions-Tightening Cold Cleaning Requirements: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Parts 211, 218, and 219 Subpart E, a Proposed Rule, First Notice, Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JTM)

An Order requesting an amended petition, and directing the attorneys for the petitioner to file a motion to appear pro hoc vice as required by 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.107(b), was adopted in #AS 97-6, Petition of Granite City Steel for an Adjusted Standard from 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.212 and 302.213, Water Quality Standard Relating to Ammonia, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (CAM)

An Opinion and Order granting the joint motion requesting relief from the Illinois Environmental Protection Act' hearing requirement and accepting the partial Stipulation and Settlement Agreement in the amount of \$232,800.00, was adopted in #95-163, People of the State of Illinois v. Clark Refining and Marketing, Inc., by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (CAM)

An Opinion and Order affirming the decision of the Village of Dolton granting local siting approval for the expansion to Land and Lakes Company's River Bend Prairie facility, vacating November 11, 1996 Order as it relates to the Village of Dolton's motion for costs, and directing the petitioners to pay the costs for the Village of Dolton's expenses related to the costs of preparing and certifying the record below pursuant to Section 39.2(n) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, was adopted in #97-68, Senator William Shaw, Ronnie Lewis and Judith Evans v. Board of Trustees of the Village of Dolton, Mayor Donald Hart and Land and Lakes Company, by a vote of 7-0. Board Member M. McFawn concurred. (JY)

An Opinion and Order granting the petitioner a variance from 35 Ill. Adm. Code 304.141(a) and 304.120(c) so that it may complete the rehabilitation of its facility subject to conditions, was

An Order granting the petitioner's motion for summary judgment, denying the Agency's crossmotion for summary judgment, and remanding the matter back to the Agency for issuance of petitioner's revised permits consistent with petitioner's application and the order, was adopted in ##97-35, - 36, Illinois Power Company (Units 1 and 2 - Baldwin Power Station) v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (JY)

An Order granting the complainants' motion to add the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois as a respondent, and directing the hearing officer not to set the matter for hearing until after the University has filed a response, was adopted in #97-50, Lionel P. Trepanier, Daniel Miller, Wes Wager, Maureen Cole, Lorenz Joseph, Maxworks Garden Cooperative and Avi Pandya v. Speedway Wrecking Company and the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, by a vote of 7-0. **(KMH)**

An Order determining that the complaint was neither duplications or frivolous, striking the request for attorneys fees and interest, as accrued, as frivolous, and accepting the matter for hearing, was adopted in #97-100, Farmers State Bank, Pittsfield, Illinois v. Phillips Petroleum Company, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (CAM)

An Order extending the 35-day appeal period, reserving the docket for any appeal which may be filed by the petitioner, noting that in the event that the petitioner fails to file an appeal on or before March 31, 1997, the Board will dismiss the docket as unnecessary, and advising the petitioner that a \$75.00 filing fee will be required at such time as the petitioner files a petition, was adopted in #97-120, Ingleside Citgo Services, Inc. v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

ADDENDUM

An Order accepting the matter for hearing, was adopted in #97-97, OK Service Center v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

An Order sending the matter to hearing due to a letter received from Donna Showalter objecting to the grant of the variance, was adopted in #97-102, Borden Chemicals and Plastics Operating Limited Partnership v. IEPA, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (McF)

An Order extending the 35-day appeal period, reserving the docket for any appeal which may be filed by the petitioner, noting that in the event that the petitioner fails to file an appeal on or before March 17, 1997, the Board will dismiss the docket as unnecessary, and advising the petitioner that a \$75.00 filing fee will be required at such time as the petitioner files a petition, was adopted in #97-122, Shell Oil Company v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

A provisional variance was granted in #97-123, Illinois Power Company (Baldwin Power Station) v. IEPA, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (CAM)
