### MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 18, 1997 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS - 10:30 A.M.

After calling the meeting to order, Chairman Manning welcomed members of the public and staff to the meeting. Thereafter, the Clerk was asked for a roll call and all Board Members answered present.

Minutes of the September 4, 1997 Board Meeting were approved by a vote of 7-0.

In R97-21, RCRA Update, USEPA Regulations (July 1 through December 31, 1997; R98-3, UIC Update, USEPA Regulations (January 1 through June 30, 1997); R98-5, RCRA Update, USEPA Regulations (January 1 through June 30, 1997), an Order consolidating the three identical-insubstance update dockets and setting forth reasons for delay as to the adoption of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (KMH)

In R95-25, Conforming Amendments for the Great Lakes Initiative: 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.101, 302.105, 302.Subpart E, 303.443, and 304.222, an Order granting the motions for leave to file comments, to supplement the record, and to accept language changes, and ruling on the motions to establish a subdocket reserved, was adopted by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (GTG)(CAM)(JY)

In R97-28, Site-Specific Petition of Mobil Oil Corporation for Relief from 35 Ill. Adm. Code 304.122, Ammonia Nitrogen Effluent Standards, a Proposed Rule, First Notice, Opinion and Order, was adopted by a vote of 5-1. Board Member J. Theodore Meyer dissented, and Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (RCF)

In R97-31, Wood Furniture Coating Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Parts 211, 218, and 291. Subpart F, a Proposed Rule, First Notice, Opinion and Order, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (RCF)

An Order granting the petitioner's motion for leave to file instanter an amended petition and then accepting the petition for hearing, was adopted in #AS 97-9, Petition of Recycle Technologies, Inc. for an Adjusted Standard from 35 Ill. Adm. Code 720.131(c), by a vote of 7-0. **(KMH)** 

An Order advising the petitioner that new sections cannot be added to the Board's regulations in an adjusted standard proceeding, but only through the rulemaking process as provided Title VII of the Environmental Protection Act, and for purposes of allowing the matter to proceed, construing the petitioner's recommended regulatory language as language requested for the adjusted standard order, noting that the Agency has not filed its response to the petitioner's amended petition, and advising the petitioner that the Board will proceed with decision in the matter as soon after filing of the Agency's response as Board resources allow, was adopted in #AS 97-10, Petition of Waste Professionals, Inc., d/b/a Pekin Landfill, for an Adjusted Standard

from 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 814, Subpart D, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (RCF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #AS 98-1, Petition of Carus Chemical Company for an Adjusted Standard from 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 814.Subpart D, by a vote of 6-1. Board Member J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (GTG)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #97-228, Waste Professionals, Inc., d/b/a Pekin Landfill v. IEPA, by a vote of 6-1. Board Member J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (RCF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #AC 97-41, County of Will v. Utilities Unlimited, Inc., and Charles Petrekis, Sr., d/b/a Utilities Unlimited, Inc., by a vote of 7-0. (JTM)

A Default Order finding that the respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1), (p)(3) and (p))4) of the Environmental Protection Act, and assessing a #1,500.00 penalty, was adopted in #AC 98-5, County of Will v. Edward Fogarty, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

Because a petition for review was filed by the respondent, this administrative citation was accepted for hearing: #98-8, County of Will v. William Hunter.

An Order directing the Clerk of the Board to cause publication of the required newspaper notice of a motion for relief from hearing requirement, was adopted in #94-83, People of the State of Illinois v. George Ribble, by a vote of 7-0. (McF)

An Order granting respondent's motion for reconsideration, and upon reconsideration, staying the proceedings pending resolution of the federal lawsuit, and vacating that portion of the Board's July 10, 1997 order consolidating PCB 96-180 and PCB 97-11, was adopted in ##96-180, - 97-11, Environmental Site Developers, Inc. v. White & Brewer Trucking, Inc., and People of the State of Illinois v. White & Brewer Trucking, Inc., by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (McF)

An Order directing the Clerk of the Board to cause publication of the required newspaper notice of a motion to request relief from hearing requirement, was adopted in #96-263, People of the State of Illinois v. Field Container Company, Ltd., and Field Container Management Corporation, by a vote of 7-0. (McF)

An Order accepting the joint status report, granting the joint motion for stay of the proceedings until October 20, 1997, ordering that the parties submit another status report advising the Board of the status of the parties' negotiations towards a resolution of the matter, and advising the parties that in the event additional stays are needed, such requests should be directed to the hearing officer who was authorized by the Board to rule on such motions, was adopted in #97-23, The City of Lockport v. IEPA, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (JY)

Respondent's motion for an extension of time to file a motion to dismiss in #97-30, People of the State of Illinois v. Shell Oil Company, was handled by the hearing officer.

An Order denying the respondent's motion to dismiss and ordering the case to hearing on the merits of the allegations contained in the complaint, was adopted in #97-92, People of the State of Illinois v. Victor G. Heuermann, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (CAM)

An Order granting the complainant's motion for reconsideration, and upon reconsideration, replaced its September 4, 1997 order in its entirety, was adopted in #97-127, People of the State of Illinois v. Pettibone Corporation, by a vote of 7-0. (JTM)

An Order granting the petitioner's motion to dismiss, was adopted in ##97-142, - 152, Scott-Morgan CUSD #2 v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (KMH)

An Order construing the parties' stipulation for dismissal as a motion to withdraw the complaint and closing the docket, was adopted in #97-143, Jeffrey J. Webb v. The City of Anna, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (RCF)

An Order denying the respondent's motion for summary judgment, and directing that the matter proceed to hearing, was adopted in #97-174, Bernice Loschen v. Grist Mill Confections, Inc., by a vote of 7-0. (JY)

An Order denying the petitioner's motion for reconsideration of the Board's July 10, 1997 order, was adopted in #97-194, Department of the Navy, Naval Training Center Great Lakes v. IEPA and R. Lavin & Sons, Inc., by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (CAM)

An Order granting the petitioner's motion for leave to file its amended petition and restated affidavit of Jon D. Stewart, declining to accept the petitioner's waiver of hearing, and accepting the matter for hearing as required by 35 Ill. Adm. Code 106.604(a), was adopted in #97-199, Tri Star Marketing, Inc. v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (RCF)

As Order directing the Clerk of the Board to cause publication of the required newspaper notice of a motion for relief from hearing requirement, was adopted in #97-225, People of the State of Illinois v. Heartland Pork Enterprises, Inc., by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (CAM)

An Order granting the petitioner's motion for leave to file instanter its response to the Agency's recommendation, and noting that in its response the petitioner waived the decision deadline in the case for an additional sixty days, making the new decision deadline for the case December 28, 1997, was adopted in #98-1, City of Salem v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (McF)

An Order dismissing and closing the docket due to the petitioner's failure to timely file its petition for review, was adopted in #98-3, Wheelabrator Water Technologies, Inc. v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

An Order granting the complainant's motion to voluntarily dismiss and closing the docket, was adopted in #98-9, Edward Malina v. Emro Marketing Company and Marathon Oil Company, by a vote of 7-0. **(CAM)**

An Order extending the 35-day appeal period, reserving the docket for any appeal which may be filed by the petitioner, noting that in the event the petitioner fails to file an appeal on or before November 10, 1997, the Board will dismiss the docket, and advising the petitioner that a \$75.00 filing fee will be required at such time as the petitioner files a petition for review, was adopted in #98-39, W.E.S. Enterprises, Inc. v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

An Order consolidating the matters on the Board's own motion, and accepting the matters for hearing, was adopted in ##98-40, - 41, James Fisher and Holly Fisher v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)




