A.M. SESSION

All Board Members were present.

An Order ordering Respondent James Smith to respond in writing by March 9, 1987 to show cause why the Board should not find him in violation of the regulations cited by Complainant was adopted in #85-4, John Eilrich, by a vote of 6-0. (RF)

An Order affording parties until March 16, 1987 to submit a signed settlement agreement to the Board in #85-88, Richard Nauman, was adopted by a vote of 6-0. (JD)

An Opinion and Order were adopted in #85-202, Metropolitan Sanitary District CSO, by a vote of 6-0. (JD)

An Opinion and Order were adopted in #86-3, City of Oglesby CSO, by a vote of 5-1. Mr. Forcade dissented. (JA)

An Opinion and order were adopted in #86-202, Bloomington and Normal Sanitary District, by a vote of 6-0. (RF)

A Proposed Rule, First Notice, Opinion and Order were adopted in R84-16, Mobil Oil Site-Specific, by a vote of 6-0. (JM)
