All Board Members were present.

An Opinion and order was adopted in #86-4, City of Morris CSO, by a vote of 5-2. Messrs. B. Forcade and J. Marlin dissented. (JD)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #86-187, New Jersey Zinc, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #87-107, Lake County Public Works, by a vote of 5-2. Messrs. J. Dumelle and B. Forcade dissented. (JTM)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #87-161, Department of the Army, by a vote of 7-0. (RF)

A Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Order was adopted in R82-7, Alton Site-Specific, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

An Interim Order was adopted in R85-27, Special Waste Categorization, by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

An Adopted Rule, Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted in R86-10, Pharmaceutical VOC, by a vote of 7-0. JD)
