ORDER OF THE BOARD (by A. Tin):

On February 6, 2025, the Board reviewed a citizen's enforcement complaint filed by Mr. Laurenzana on January 24, 2025, under Section 31(d) of the Act and Part 103 of the Board's procedural rules. The Board concluded that the complaint did not identify as a respondent any person or persons alleged to have committed a violation on which the Board can conduct a hearing. Also, as with an amended petition for review Mr. Laurenzana filed on January 6, 2025, the complaint did "not include documentation of service on anyone." *See Laurenzana v. IEPA*, PCB 25-27, slip op. at 2 (Jan. 23, 2025). Because an enforcement complaint begins with serving the complaint on all respondents (35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.204(a)), and Mr. Laurenzana failed to document service on anyone, the Board did not determine whether the complaint was frivolous or duplicative. The Board declined to accept the complaint.

However, if Mr. Laurenzana wished to pursue an enforcement action against one or more respondents, the Board directed him to file an amended complaint and serve it on all respondents in compliance with the Act and the Board's procedural rules by Monday, March 10, 2025. *See* 415 ILCS 5/31(d) (2022); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103. Because the Board did not receive a timely amended complaint and Mr. Laurenzana has not remedied the deficiencies identified in the Board's February 6, 2025 order, the Board dismisses this case and closes the docket. If Mr. Laurenzana wishes, he may file a new complaint, which must meet the requirements of the Act and Board rules and would be treated as a new case and assigned a new docket number. *See, e.g., Whisenhunt v. Moore*, PCB 14-34 (Apr. 17, 2014).
