ILLINOIS POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD June 12, 1980

IN THE MATTER OF: SULFUR DEOXIDE REGULATIONS, R77-15 R78-14 RULE 204(c)(1)(A) OF CHAPTER 2

ORDER OF THE BOARD (by I. Goodman):

The Agency's May 27, 1980 Motion to Keep Records Open until December 1, 1980 is denied. Section 9.2 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act) mandates that the Agency shall by July 1, 1980 propose any appropriate amendments to sulfur dioxide emission regulations applicable to existing, fuel combustion, stationary sources located within the major metropolitan areas of Chicago, St. Louis (Illinois), and Peoria. Such statute clearly contemplates that the Illinois Institute of Natural Resources commission an economic impact study separate from the one concerning the instant proceedings. The Legislature's intent would not be served by consolidating the new §9.2 proceedings with the instant ones. There is, therefore, no compelling reason to keep the instant records open.

Furthermore, the Agency represents that the amendments it may propose are based on modeling currently being undertaken and "likely to be completed in time ... to present regulatory proposals before December 1, 1980." The Board finds that to grant the Agency's motion would, at least indirectly, recognize noncompliance with §9.2 of the Act.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
