## OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD:

This matter comes before the Board upon a three-count complaint filed February 2, 1994, by Roland W. Burris, Attorney General of the State of Illinois, on behalf of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the People of the State of Illinois, against Jays Food Inc., an Illinois Corporation located at 825 E. 99th Street, in the City of Chicago, Cook County, Illinois. The complaint alleges that Jays Foods has violated Sections 9(b) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act), 415 ILCS 5/9(b) and 35 Ill. Adm. Code §§ 201.142, 201.143, 201.144 and 201.162 for operating and constructing emission sources without the proper permits.

Pursuant to 415 ILCS 5/31(a)(1), the parties filed a joint Motion requesting relief from the Act's hearing requirement on February 2, 1994. The Board published a Notice of the waiver on February 7, 1994; no objection to grant of the waiver was received. Waiver of hearing is hereby granted.

The parties filed a Stipulation and Settlement Agreement on February 2, 1994. The Stipulation sets forth facts relating to the nature, operations and circumstances surrounding the claimed violations. Jays Food neither admits nor denies the alleged violations and agrees to pay a civil penalty of eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.00).

The Board finds the settlement agreement acceptable under 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.180. This settlement agreement in no way affects respondent's responsibility to comply with any federal, state or local regulations, including but not limited to the Act and the Board's pollution control regulations.

This opinion constitutes the Board's findings of fact and

conclusions of law in this matter.

## ORDER

- The Board hereby accepts the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement executed by the People of the State of Illinois and Jays Foods, concerning its facility located in Cook County, Illinois. The Stipulation and Settlement Agreement are incorporated by reference as though fully set forth herein.
- The Jays Foods, shall pay the sum of eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.00) within 30 days of the date of this Order. Such payment shall be made by certified check or money order payable to the Treasurer of the State of Illinois, designated to the Environmental Protection Trust Fund, and shall be sent by First Class mail to:

The certified check or money order shall clearly indicate on its face, the Jays Foods Federal Employer Identification Number or Social Security Number and that payment is directed to the Environmental Protection Trust Fund.

Any such penalty not paid within the time prescribed shall incur interest at the rate set forth in subsection (a) of Section 1003 of the Illinois Income Tax Act, (35 ILCS 5/1003), as now or hereafter amended, from the date payment is due until the date payment is received. Interest shall not accrue during the pendency of an appeal during which payment of the penalty has been stayed.

3) Jays Foods shall cease and desist from the alleged violations.
