ORDER OF THE BOARD (by J.C. Marlin):

This matter comes before the Board on receipt of an Agency Recommendation dated October 8, 1991 which has a incorrect paragraph 3 and an amended Agency Recommendation dated October 9, 1991 with incorrect paragraphs 1 and 2. The Board is relying on the correct paragraphs, as indicated by the Agency, from both filings. The recommendation states that the Petitioner is a small quantity generator as defined by 35 Ill. Adm. Code 722.134(d). The recommendation refers to a request from Petitioner, for a 30-day provisional variance from the 180-day limitation on the storage of hazardous wastes, as set forth in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 722.134(f), for the period from October 10, 1991 to November 9, 1991.

Upon receipt of the request, the Agency issued its recommendation, finding that due to unforeseen, temporary and uncontrollable circumstances, failure to grant the requested 30-day provisional variance would impose an arbitrary or unreasonable hardship on Petitioner.

The responsibilities of the Agency and the Board in these short-term provisional variances are different from the responsibilities in standard variances. See Ill. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. $111\frac{1}{2}$, pars. 1035 (b) & (c). In provisional variances it is the responsibility of the Agency to make the technical determinations and finding of arbitrary or unreasonable hardship. The Board's responsibility is to adopt a formal Order, to assure the formal maintenance of the record, to assure the enforceability of the variance, and to provide notification of the action by a press release.

Having received the Agency recommendation finding that a denial of the requested relief would impose an arbitrary and unreasonable hardship, the Board hereby grants Petitioner a provisional variance from 35 Ill. Adm. Code 722.134(f) from October 10, 1991 to November 9, 1991.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
