ORDER OF THE BOARD (by J. Marlin):

On February 2, 1989, the Can-Am Industries, Inc. (Can-Am) filed a variance petition. However, Can-Am did not submit the appropriate filing fee when the petition was filed. Can-Am may have been unaware of recent amendments to the Environmental Protection Act which prescribe filing fees. P.A. 35-1331 (effective January 1, 1989).

Pursuant to Resolution 88-3 (a copy of which is attached), the Board finds that the petition is deficient for failure to submit a filing fee of 75 dollars. In addition, the Board finds that the 120-day statutory decision period does not begin running until the appropriate filing fee is received by the Board.

Unless Can-Am files a filing fee within 21 days of the date of this Order the petition will be subject to dismissal.

Additionally, the Board notes that a hearing is required since the variance request involves air regulations.
