what this sewer connection ban does is to prevent new sanitary sewers from being hooked onto the old combined sewer system in cases where it is not cost effective to run a long sewer main directly to the sewage treatment plant or through the combined sewer area.	
Combined sewer systems, by definition, are designed to handle large volumes of water compared to dry weather flows. Thus, the introduction of additional dry weather flow, unless extremely large, should cause no problem at all in dry weather and little additional discharge during rains.	
There is nothing in this record to indicate what special concerns exist to justify this ban. The ban was not requested by the Agency and should not have been enacted by the majority.
