INTERIM ORDER 1. THE BOARD (by B. Forcade):

On March 1985, the Village of Hartford ("Village") and the Illinois Followmental Protection Agency ("Agency") filed for an exception 1948 35 Ill. Adm. Code 306.305 (a) and (b) of the Board's combined sever overflow regulations. By Order of March 22, 1985, the Board noted a deficiency in the petition, pertaining to information required by 35 Ill. Adm. Code 306.363(d) [relating to variances or enforcement status] and requested this matter be addressed at hearing. In reviewing the presently existing record, the Board has been unable to find this information. Consequently, the Board will again request information on prior variances and enforcement status relating to the Village of Hartford. Additionally, the Board will request information on five other matters.

The Village of Hartford or the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency is ordered to provide the Board, within 60 days of the date of this Order, with the following information:

- 1. A statement, as required by 35 Ill. Adm. Code 306.363(d); as to whether the Village has previously been granted any variances or been subject to any enforcement action.
- 2. A statement on the present status of the Wood River Regional Wastewater Treatment project, including any anticipated schedule for the Village of the Hartford to hook-up to that project.
- 3. A statement of clarification as to what percentage of the first flush of a one-year, one-hour storm would be captured by the pumping system proposed by the Village of Hartford and the Agency in their draft order.
- 4. A discussion of the present compliance status of the facility: e.g., does the facility qualify for the exemption of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 304.301?

- 5. A clearer statement of the relief requested. Is the relief prospective only, i.e., after the Wood River Regional Treatment Project is operational, or is it presently needed?
- 6. A statement that the time limitations of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 306.351 have been met?
