CONCURRING OPINION (by J. D. Dumelle):


The penalty set by the majority in this case is far too low. It will not deter others from making a travesty out of the requirement to reasonably maintain and operate a sewage treatment plant.

I recommended a penalty of \$5,000 in this case. Seven months to perform a routine repair on a primary tank is far too long. And other repairs were not done promptly.
