CONCURRING OPINION (by J.D. Dumelle):

My main reason for concurring in this provisional variance grant is the conclusory nature of the environmental impact as presented by the Agency. The BOD discharges are being icreased by 150% in this variance (from 20 mg/l to 50 mg/l) into the Illinois River just upstream of the LaGrange Pool. This portion of the Illinois River has long had low dissolved oxygen levels. Yet we have here only a conclusory statement about environmental impact with no showing that the dissolved oxygen problem has even been specifically studied.

I agree with Board Member Joan Anderson that the instant petition is deficient on its face since an initial 45-day period is all that is contemplated by the statute. The conventional variance route with expedited consideration, if necessary, should have been used in this case.
