IN THE MATTER OF: AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 3: WATER POLLUTION (Effluent) Disinfection)

Proposed Rule. First Notice.

PROPOSED ORDER OF THE BOARD (by J.D. Dumelle):

The Board proposes to delete Rules 203(g) and 205(d) and amend Rule 405 of Chapter 3: Water Pollution, for fecal coliform. Since Chapter 3 has now been codified and since that codification should be effective prior to these amendments taking effect, the proposed amendments are presented in a codified format. The following table shows the pertinent relationships between present Chapter 3 rules and the codified rules.

The deleted and amended rules are to read as below (added language is underlined; deleted language is lined through):

Section 302.209 <u>Deleted</u> Feeal-Coliform Based-on-a-minimum-of-five-samples-taken-over-not more-than-a-30-day-period,-feeal-coliforms-(STORET number-31616)-shall-not-exceed-a-geometrie-mean of-200-per-100-ml,-nor-shall-more-than-10%-of-the samples-during-any-30-day-period-exceed-400-per 100-ml.

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Section 302.406 Deleted Feeal-Coliform
Based-on-a-minimum-of-five-samples-taken-over-not-more
than-a-30-day-period7-feeal-coliforms-(STORET-number
31616)-shall-not-exceed-a-geometric-mean-of-17000-per
100-m17-nor-shall-more-than-10%-of-the-samples-during
any-30-day-period-exceed-27000-per-100-m1.
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Section 304.121 No effluent governed by this Part which discharges to the following locations shall exceed 400 fecal coliform per 100 ml-:

- a) Within 20 stream miles (32.26 kilometers) upstream of a public bathing beach licensed by the Illinois Department of Public Health under the "Illinois Swimming Pool and Bathing Beach Act" (Chapter 111 1/2 Ill. Rev. Stats, 1977, Paragraph 1201-1227).
- Stats. 1977, Paragraph 1201-1227).
 b) Within 20 stream miles (32.26 kilometers) upstream of a water intake used for public or food processing water supply.
- c) To any location where it may cause or contribute to violation of another state's water quality standards in interstate waters.
- d) Within 20 stream miles (32.26 kilometers) upstream of any lake within the State.
- e) Within 20 stream miles (32.26 kilometers) upstream of any point on the Illinois River which is downstream of mile marker 263.5 near Morris, Illinois.

The Board further proposes to amend the Rule 104 definition of "Primary Contact" as follows:

Section 301.355 Primary Contact

"Primary Contact" means any recreational-or-other water use in-which-there-is of a prolonged and intimate contact nature with-the-water- (such as swimming and water skiing) such that there is a involving considerable likehood risk of ingesting water-in significant quantities of water. sufficient to-pose-a-significant-health-hasard, such as swimming-and water-skiing;

The Clerk is directed to initiate First Notice proceedings pursuant to the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act.
