## ILLINOIS POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD March 15, 1973

ORDER OF THE BOARD (BY SAMUEL T. LAWTON, JR.):

Letter has been received from petitioner which we interpret as a request for variance from our sewer ban order entered in League of Women Voters v. North Shore Sanitary District, ##70-7, 12, 13 and 14 (March 7, 1971) 1 PCB 369, to enable a sewer connection to facilities tributary to the Lake Bluff sewage treatment plant. Petitioner alleges that his septic tanks are in bad condition.

We are unable to tell from petitioner's communication whether a serious health hazard is likely if sewer connection is denied and we do not know the costs and difficulties that might be encountered if the septic system was upgraded.

Petitioner shall file the requisite information within 15 days from receipt of this order, including a letter from the Lake County Health Department indicating its evaluation of the future suitability of the septic system.

The 90-day period in which a variance must be determined shall begin to run from the date of the receipt of the foregoing submissions. On failure to receive such submissions, the variance petition shall be dismissed.
