We believe the motion to be well founded, and it is hereby granted. This Board's November 28, 1972 Order is hereby amended to delete Paragraph 2 thereof, and to substitute the following:

2. "The North Shore Sanitary District certifies that, according to projections as to the level of treatment to be available in September, 1974, discharge of effluent from the North Chicago treatment plant including the added waste load from petitioner's development will meet the relevant standards of the water pollution regulations of the State of Illinois."
