JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the County of Macon by section 4(r) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/4(r) (2002).

FACTS

1. That Respondent, Pete Bourisaw is the present owner and operator of a facility located at 401 Railroad Avenue, Blue Mound, Illinois 62513, Macon County, Illinois.

2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 1150105018.

3. That Respondent has owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.

4. That on September 29, 2004, Michael Warnick of the Macon County Solid Waste Management Department inspected the above-described facility. A copy of his inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Michael Warnick during the course of his September 29, 2004 inspection of the above-named facility, the Macon County Solid Waste Management Department has determined that Respondents violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in Litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2002).
- (2) That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in Deposition of General Construction or Demolition Debris, a violation of Section 21(p)(7) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7) (2002).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2002), Respondents are subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00)</u>. If Respondents elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>February 01, 2005</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2002), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondents shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Macon County Solid Waste Management Department and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2002), if Respondents fail to petition or elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative

Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondents' check shall be made payable to the Macon County Solid Waste Management Department and should be mailed to the attention of Sherri L. Ludlam, Macon County Solid Waste Management Department; 141 South Main Street, Room 212, Decatur, Illinois, 62523-1293. Along with payment, Respondents shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondents from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Macon County State's Attorney may initiate proceedings against Respondents in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondents have the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2002). If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondents shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Office of the Macon County State's Attorney, 253 E. Wood Street, Decatur, Illinois, 62523. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondents.

- #2 By December 01, 2004, you must remove all waste to a permitted landfill or transfer station. Scrap metal not disposed at a landfill can be taken to a scrap metal facility or recycling center.
- #3 By December 01, 2004, you must remove all white goods (i.e., large appliances) to a facility that can legitimately accept them for recycling. White goods cannot be taken to a landfill or transfer station for the purpose of disposal. All Freon-containing appliances must be vacated in accordance with all applicable state and federal regulations. Proof of compliance may be requested..
- #4 By December 15, 2004, you must submit to the Macon County Solid Waste Management Department, copies of receipts that document the proper disposal or recycling of the wastes.

Within forty-five (45) calendar days of the date of this Citation, you must submit writing:

- 1. Information in rebuttal, explanation, or justification of each alleged violation;
- 2. A proposed Compliance Commitment Agreement (CCA) that spells out how you plan to rectify each violation (including time frames) and return the area to compliance. If you feel compliance has already been achieved, please state such in your CCA;
- 3. If you desire, a request for a meeting with the Macon County Solid Waste Management Department regarding the alleged violations.

Your written response of all documents submitted in reply to this notice must be sent, via certified mail return-receipt, to:

On any correspondence you send concerning this matter, please reference the IEPA designated facility number and facility name listed on the first page of this notice.

An Administrative Citation carries a fine of \$1,500.00 for a first offense and \$3,000 for a second or subsequent offense for violation of any provision of Section 21(p).

Inspection Report Narrative

This site was inspected by Michael Warnick representing the Macon County Solid Waste Management Department on September 29, 2004. The inspection occurred between 8:21 and 8:27 in the morning. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were of sunny skies, moderate wind conditions, and temperatures in the 50's. Two photographs were taken, no one was interviewed, and no samples were collected.

General Information/Site History

This site is located in Southwestern Macon County. The property is located in the Village of Blue Mound, in the 400 block of Railroad Avenue. The reason for the inspection was to investigate possible violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act due to open dumping of waste to the south of the building. A prior inspection of this facility was conducted on February 25, 2004. That inspection found violations of open dumping of plumbing fixtures and construction and demolition debris, as well as violations of open burning. An ACWN was issued and responded to by the business owner. The violations were corrected by April 15, 2004.

Inspection Findings

I arrived at the property and immediately noticed that open dumping of plumbing fixtures and construction and demolition debris had resumed on the south side of the business. I walked over to the waste pile, and noticed several water heaters, furnaces, PVC pipe, and Freon cylinders (photographs 1 & 2). I was able to count nine cylinders of Freon 22, eleven water heaters, two furnaces, several sections of PVC pipe, ten bags of relatively new shingles, an air conditioner and a sink that were open dumped in a pile on the south side of the business.

At the time of the inspection, I did not make contact with the business owner. I left the property and ended my inspection at 8:27.

Summary of Apparent Violations

Environmental Protection Act ILCS 5/1 et seq. (formerly III Rev. Stat. Ch. 111 ½, 1001 et seq.) {hereinafter referred to as the "Act"}

Section 21(a) of the Act. No person shall cause or allow the open dumping of any waste.

Section 21(d), (1) of the Act. No person shall conduct any waste-storage, wastetreatment, or waste-disposal operation...without a permit granted by the Agency, or in violation of any conditions imposed by such permits.

Section 21(d), (2) of the Act. No person shall conduct any waste-storage, waste-treatment, or waste-disposal operation...that is in violation of any regulations or standards adopted by the board under this Act.

Section 21(e) of the Act. No person shall dispose, treat, store, or abandon any waste, or transport any waste into the State of Illinois for disposal, treatment, storage, or abandonment at/to sites not meeting requirements of the act.


