**NOTICE OF WAIVER OF 120-DAY
DECISION DEADLINE FOR AN ADDITIONAL 60 DAYS**

NOW COMES Petitioner, LONE STAR INDUSTRIES, INC., d/b/a Buzzi Unicem USA (hereinafter "Petitioner"), by and through its attorneys, HODGE DWYER ZEMAN, pursuant to 35 Ill. Admin. Code § 101.308(c)(2), and hereby agrees to waive the statutory 120-day decision deadline for final action by the Illinois Pollution Control Board in this proceeding for an additional 60 days, or until November 17, 2008. In support of this Notice, Petitioner states as follows:

1. On January 29, 2007, Petitioner filed a Petition for Review of the revised construction permit granted to Petitioner by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency on December 22, 2006.
2. On April 4, 2008, Petitioner filed its sixth Notice of Waiver of 120-Day Decision Deadline in this matter. The current statutory deadline for this matter is September 18, 2008.
3. Petitioner hereby voluntarily agrees to waive the statutory 120-day decision deadline for an additional 60 days, or until November 17, 2008, in order to continue to conduct settlement negotiations in this matter.
