NOW COMES Petitioner, the Illinois Department of Transportation ("Department") by and through its attorneys, and moves the Illinois Pollution Control Board ("Board") to grant its request for leave to file *instanter* its Motion to Continue to Stay Proceedings and Status Report states and asserts as follows:

1. On December 20, 2007, the Board granted the Department's Motion to Stay the Proceedings of the In Matter of: Triennial Review of Sulfate and Total Dissolved Solids Water Quality Standards: Proposed Amendments To 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.102(b)(6), 302.102(b)(8), 302.102(b)(10), 302.208(g), 309.103(c)(3), 405.109(b)(2)(A), 409.109(b)(2)(B), 406.100(d); Repealer of 30 Ill. Adm. Code 406.203 and Part 407; and Proposed New 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.208(h), R07-9 ("Triennial Rule") which satisfies the Department's petition for adjusted standard for sulfate and total dissolved solids ("TDS"). In the Order, the Board stated that the Stay will terminate "through final Board action in Triennial, at which time the Department must, within 45 days thereafter, file with the Board either a motion to voluntarily dismiss AS 08-1, or notice of the Department's intent to go forward with the adjusted standard proceeding, accompanied by a status report."

- 2. On September 4, 2008, the Board adopted the <u>Triennial</u> Rule and set for forth final notice.
- 3. The Department inadvertently failed to file with the Board within 45 days of the Board's final action in the <u>Triennial</u> Rule as required by the Board's December 20, 2007 Order.
- 4. This Motion for Leave to File *instanter* is made in good faith and is not for the purpose of undue delay.

MOTION TO CONTINUE TO STAY PROCEEDINGS

NOW COMES Petitioner, the Illinois Department of Transportation ("Department") by and through its attorneys, and requests that the Illinois Pollution Control Board ("Board") continue to stay the proceedings in this matter, pending the United States Environmental Protection Agency's ("USEPA's") 40 CFR 131.21 review of the <u>Triennial</u> Rule stating as follows:

- 1. On July 27, 2007, the Department filed a petition for an adjusted standard from the Board's general use water quality standards for sulfate and total dissolved solids ("TDS") at 35 Ill. Adm. Code. The Department's petition for relief concerns discharge from its District 8 Bowman Avenue Pump Station in East St. Louis, St. Clair County. In its petition, the Department proposed adjusted standards of 642 mg/L for sulfate and 1,128 mg/L for TDS.
- 2. On November 13, 2007, the Department filed a Motion to Stay Proceedings, pending the Board's decision in <u>Triennial Review of Sulfate and Total Solids Water Quality Standards</u> ("<u>Triennial</u>") which would satisfy the Department's adjusted standard proposed for sulfate and TDS.
- 3. On December 20, 2007, the Board granted the Department's Motion to Stay, stating the Stay would be terminated "through final Board action in <u>Triennial</u>, at which time the

Department must, within 45 days thereafter, file with the Board either a motion to voluntarily

dismiss AS 08-1, or notice of the Department's intent to go forward with the adjusted standard

proceeding, accompanied by a status report."

4. On September 4, 2008, the Board adopted the <u>Triennial</u> Rule and directed the

Clerk to file with the Secretary of State for publication in the Illinois Register for final adoption.

The Triennial Rule, as adopted on September 4, 2008 satisfies the Department's petition for

adjusted standard for sulfate and TDS. To the Department's knowledge, the USEPA has not

issued a review of the Triennial Rule as required under 40 CFR 131.21.

5. The Department requests that the Board continue to Stay the proceedings pending

the USEPA's review of the Triennial Rule.

6. This Motion to Continue to Stay is made in good faith and is not for the purpose

of undue delay. A stay of the Department's petition could preserve Board resources and promote

judicial economy.

WHEREFORE, the Department requests that the Board stay the proceedings in this

matter until such time the USEPA issues a review of the Triennial Rule pursuant to 40 CFR

131.21.

STATUS REPORT

NOW COMES Petitioner, the Illinois Department of Transportation ("Department") by and through its attorney, and submits this Status Report in this matter.

On July 27, 2007, the Department filed a Petition for Adjusted Standard requesting relief from the Board's general use water quality standards for sulfate and total dissolved solids (TDS) at 35 IL. Adm. Code 302.208(g).

On September 20, 2007, the Board issued an Order adopting the first-notice proposal in the <u>Triennial</u> Rule (R 07-09).

On November 13, 2007, the Department filed a Motion to Stay the Proceedings pending the decision in the <u>Triennial</u> Rule.

On December 20, 2007, the Board granted the Department's Motion to Stay, stating the Stay would be "terminated through final Board action in <u>Triennial</u>, at which time the Department must, within 45 days thereafter, file with the Board either a motion to voluntarily dismiss AS 08-1, or notice of the Department's intent to go forward with the adjusted standard proceeding, accompanied by a status report."

On May 1, 2008, the Board issued an order proposing a second-notice opinion proposal

in the Triennial Rule.

On June 19, 2008 the Board adopted proposed amendments for second notice for the

Triennial Rule. The amended Triennial Rule still satisfies the Department's petition for adjusted

standards for sulfate and TDS.

On September 4, 2008, the Board adopted the amendments for the Triennial Rule and

filed with Secretary of State for publication in Illinois Register for final adoption.

As discussed in the Department's Motion to Continue the Stay, the Triennial Rule, as

adopted on September 4, 2008 satisfies the Department's petition for adjusted standard for

sulfate and TDS and therefore becomes moot if approved by the USEPA.

WHEREFORE, the Department requests that the Board stay the proceedings in this

matter until such time the USEPA issues a review of the Triennial Rule pursuant to 40 CFR

131.21.
