JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2006).

FACTS

- That Theodore and Sally Jackson are the current owners ("Respondents") of a facility located at 1203 South 10th Street, Havana, Mason County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Havana/Jackson 2.
- 2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 1250205071.
 - 3. That Respondents have owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on October 28, 2008, William E. Zierath of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Springfield Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of his inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on <u>December 10, 2008</u> Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. <u>7004 2510 0001 8618 9378</u>.

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by William E. Zierath during the course of his October 28, 2008 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondents have violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2006).
- That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in Deposition of General Construction or Demolition Debris: or Clean Construction or Demolition Debris a violation of Section 21(p)(7) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7) (2006).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2006), Respondents are subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00)</u>. If Respondents elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>January 15, 2009</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2006), and if the Illinois

Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondents shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2006), if Respondents fail to petition or elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondents shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondents from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondents in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondents have the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2006). If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondents shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondents.

FOS File

A complaint re-investigation was conducted at this lot on the south edge of Havana on October 28, 2008. No one else was present. The weather was 65°F, and sunny during this inspection.

The complaint stated "accumulation of junk & vehicles at Jackson's property." An investigation was conducted at this site on April 22, 2008. See the memorandum of that date for details. The purpose of this follow-up investigation was to determine if the refuse observed during the April 22, 2008 investigation had been cleaned up.

There had been five abandoned cars on this site during the April 22, 2008 inspection. Two of the cars had been removed prior to the October 28, 2008 investigation. The three remaining abandoned cars are shown in photographs 1250205071~10282008-001, 1250205071~10282008-002, and 1250205071~10282008-012. The area where the other two cars used to be us shown in photograph 1250205071~10282008-005. There was one abandoned pickup truck on the site. This pickup truck is shown in photographs 1250205071~10282008-008, 1250205071~10282008-009, and 1250205071~10282008-010.

There were two abandoned mobile homes on this property during the April 22, 2008 investigation. The two mobile homes had been removed prior to the October 28, 2008 investigation. The previous locations of these two mobile homes are shown in photographs 1250205071~10282008-008 and 1250205071~10282008-012.

There was scrap metal and wooden demolition waste, along with three possibly empty 55-gallon drums located along the west side of the north building at this site. This waste is shown in photographs 1250205071~10282008-003 and 1250205071~10282008-004.

The drums located along the west side of the north building had wood boards stacked on them along with other items leaning against them. The usual method for determining whether drums contain liquids or solids is to rap on the sides of the drums. Empty drums ring with a distinctive sound. However, significant weight on top of an empty drum will deaden the sound. For this reason I was unable to determine if the drums were empty or contained wastes. Apparent violations of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 722.111 (hazardous waste determination) and 808.121 (special waste determination) are marked to address the necessity that any wastes in the drums be identified and the disposed of properly.

An orange trailer with old windows that was observed at the site during the April 22, 2008 investigation was located in the same location during this investigation. This trailer is shown in photograph 1250205071~10282008-005.

There was wooden demolition waste, scrap metal and assorted junk located along the west side of the site. This waste is shown in photographs 1250205071~10282008-006, 1250205071~10282008-007, and 1250205071~10282008-008.

The semi trailer observed at this site during the April 22, 2008 investigation was still present during this investigation. This semi trailer is shown in photograph 1250205071~10282008-008.

As observed during the April 22, 2008 investigation, there were the metal frames from the bases of mobile homes behind the semi trailer. The mobile home bases are shown in photograph 1250205071~10282008-009.

There was scattered junk in the wooded area at the south end of the site. This waste included two used tires not on rims. The waste in the southern end of the site is shown in photographs 1250205071~10282008-010, 1250205071~10282008-011, 1250205071~10282008-013, 1250205071~10282008-014, 1250205071~10282008-015, 1250205071~10282008-016, 1250205071~10282008-017, and 1250205071~10282008-018.

At the south end of the south building was a small amount of scrap metal, demolition waste and assorted junk. This waste is shown in photograph 1250205071~10282008-019.


There was wooden demolition waste stacked along the western wall of the south building. This demolition waste is shown in photograph 1250205071~10282008-020.

Most of the waste in the area south of the north building and west of the south building had been removed prior to this investigation The area is shown in photograph 1250205071~10282008-021. There were some used tires on rims leaning against the south wall. In addition, there was some scrap metal south of the southwest corner of the north building. This scrap metal is shown in photograph 1250205071~10282008-022.


