#### JURISDICTION

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This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2006).

#### **FACTS**

- 1. That Brian Collins is the current operator ("Respondent") of a facility located at 102 W. Lindell, West Frankfort, Franklin County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as West Frankfort/Collins-Jones.
- 2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 0550705066.
  - 3. That Respondent has operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on March 31, 2009, Maggie Stevenson of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Marion Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of her inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 4-30-09, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7007 3000 0002 3214 3251

#### **VIOLATIONS**

Based upon direct observations made by Maggie Stevenson during the course of her March 31, 2009 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2006).
- (2) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in open burning, a violation of Section 21(p)(3) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3)(2006).
- (3) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in Deposition of General Construction or Demolition Debris: or Clean Construction or Demolition Debris a violation of Section 21(p)(7) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7) (2006).

#### CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2006), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>June 15, 2009</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2006), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2006), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

## PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2006). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

This inspection was made as the result of a complaint received by this office. The site is located at 102 W. Lindell Street in West Frankfort, Illinois. The site was easily accessed by West Lindell Street and North Anna Street. Nine pictures were taken of the waste, which consisted of construction/demolition debris and miscellaneous debris. Open burning had occurred at the site. The property is owned by James A. Jones of 58 Brenda Street in Glen Carbon, Illinois. The operator is Brian Collins of 10603 Bencie Road in rural West Frankfort, Illinois. The parcel number is 11-24-284-007 according to the Franklin County Tax Assessor's office.

West Frankfort Fire Department called and left a message regarding this fire. The call was returned to Lt. Craig Lemmon of the fire department who informed me that the house had partially burned several months ago and was lit on fire this morning to get rid of the remainder of the house. Lt. Lemmon's verbal report stated that the house had been demolished prior to being ignited by Brian Collins. Initially, Brian Collins told a member of the fire department that he had purchased the property for back taxes but later told another member of the department that he had been hired to demolish the house. Lt. Lemmon was under the impression that Brian Collins owned the property. When a member of the fire department told him he was not supposed to burn demolished buildings he stated he did not care and became belligerent. Two fire trucks were called to the scene around 8:00 AM to extinguish the fire. Pictures were taken of the blaze by West Frankfort Fire Department (pictures and report attached).

Before going to the site I checked with the Franklin County Tax Assessor's Office to find out if Brian Collins had purchased the property for back taxes. The property taxes were up-to-date and the County Clerk's Office did not have any record of the property going up for sale for back taxes or Brian Collins having purchased any properties in Franklin County since 2006. Franklin County Tax Assessor's Office said that the tax bill was being sent to James A. Jones at the above mentioned address. It was also reported that the City of West Frankfort showed a \$200 water bill outstanding on the property.

I arrived at the site around 3:45 PM. The site contained tires (pictures 001 and 003) and miscellaneous debris (pictures 001, 002, 003, and 004). Partially burned construction/demolition debris and miscellaneous debris was present at the site (pictures 001, 003, 005, 006, 007, and 008). A hole, approximately 3' X 3' X 6', was filled with

limbs, brush, partially burned tree limbs, and carpet padding (picture 004). The site was muddy and it was evident that a fire had recently been put out. A strong burning odor emanated from the site.

While I was at the site, three boys walked through the eastern edge of the property. They asked what I was doing and I told them I was taking pictures. One boy, later identified as Master Williams, stated that he lived there until November 18, 2008 when the house caught on fire. Another boy, later identified as Master Haskel, stated that his uncle owned the house. The third boy, identified as Master Jones, said the owner was his uncle and his name was Jimmy. The boys stated that they were headed home and I asked if their parents were home. Master Williams stated yes and I asked what the address was because I needed to speak with them regarding the recent fire. He gave me the address of 108 W. 8th Street.

I drove to 108 W. 8<sup>th</sup> Street and spoke with Lori Haskel and Darrel Taylor. Lori stated that she lived in the house when it burned and her brother, James Jones of Glen Carbon, owned the house. I questioned the address of James and she stated that he lived with his x-wife, Tammy. We continued on with our discussion of the property. She stated that they had spent months trying to salvage belongings from the house and were to a point that they could not do any more. Ms. Haskel stated that her brother had hired Brian Collins to demolish the house. According to Ms. Haskel, dumpsters had been supplied for the demolition and remaining debris but Mr. Collins had filled the dumpsters with foundation block and cement and hauled them away. She stated that her brother had specifically told Mr. Collins to leave the foundation so he could re-use it for the new structure. I asked if the property was insured and Ms. Haskel stated that it was and the insurance had already paid. Ms. Haskel was very upset and stated they had been at the property during the fire. She stated that during their clean-up (Lori and Darrel) they had burned some limbs from a fallen tree and the fire department made them put it out but Mr. Collins could burn an entire house. She stated that several neighbors had tried for almost two hours to get the fire department to respond to the blaze ignited by Mr. Collins.

Ms. Haskel said that she and Mr. Taylor parked in the alley when the fire department arrived and were taking pictures on their cell phones of the fire. According to Ms. Haskel, the fire department made them leave the scene shortly after their arrival. Ms. Haskel was very distressed and reported that she had tried to contact the fire department several times that morning and when she and several others did not get immediate results from the fire department Mr. Taylor and a neighbor tried contacting IEPA.


During the interview, Ms. Haskel called her brother, James Jones. She asked if I would like to speak with him and I took the opportunity to make sure Mr. Jones knew what would be expected of him with regards to clean-up. Mr. Jones stated that he understood he was ultimately responsible as property owner and he would be required to provide me with receipts from the landfill for the remaining debris on site. He also understood that the tires could not be taken to the landfill and he would have to take them to a tire store that would accept tires for disposal. I explained to Mr. Jones that he would be receiving a letter in the mail with all the information that we discussed and that Mr. Collins would be pursued as the operator of the site. Mr. Jones confirmed that he had made arrangements for the proper disposal of the debris and I asked him to send me any documentation pertaining to that disposal arrangement. Mr. Jones was quiet and calm on the phone. I left my business card with Lori Haskel and stated I would appreciate a copy of the pictures from her cell phone if she could retrieve them and e-mail them to me.

After I left the Haskel/Taylor residence I called Mr. Jones and left a message. I asked if he could provide me with a written contract between him and Mr. Collins for the demolition of the house. I also stated that if he had any other


questions or information he could contact me at the number and address on the business card I provided to his sister,

The following morning (4/1/2009) I spoke again with the West Frankfort Fire Department. I was told at that time that Brian Collins had given conflicting information to two different firemen regarding the ownership of the property (as stated previously). I also asked about the presence of Lori Haskel and Darrel Taylor at the site during the fire. I was told that Mr. Collins had become so agitated with Lori Haskel that the department was fearful the situation would escalate to physical violence on Mr. Collins' part. I asked about dumpsters at the site during the fire and was told that the dumpsters had been removed from the site prior to the fire. I requested a copy of the fire department report and any pictures that were taken during the fire. I was informed that the West Frankfort Police Department would be issuing a ticket with a subsequent fine of up to \$500.00 for repeat offenders. I asked how many times the fire department had responded to fires for Brian Collins and was told that they had records going back several years. They also stated that Brian's father, Bill, had an extensive record of fire extinguishing.

The West Frankfort Fire Department had a report on March 31, 2009 just after 8:00 a.m. regarding the burning of what was left of the residence at the above address. Lt. Craig Lemmon toned out all off duty personnel to report to the station to assist in putting out the fire. I arrived in Engine 2, just after Craig arrived in Engine 1. I witnessed Mr. Collins and Craig exchanging words regarding the fire. As I walked up, I asked Mr. Collins if he new that it was illegal to burn a house in the city limits. He stated that the Fire Chief from up north gave him permission to do the same thing behind Kentucky Fried Chicken. I told him that he was no longer Fire Chief that Wes Taylor was Fire Chief and it was still illegal.

Craig Lemmon has 2 or 3 calls before arrival stating that Ron Rains came to our house and said we could not burn 2x4's so why does he get to burn. I told this to Mr. Collins and said that he was not the exception to the rule and that by no means can you burn lumber, roofing, etc. in the city limits. He stated that he took all of the roofing out, he roofing was found during extinguishment of the fire. I then told him that he knew that this was wrong, because we have had other calls regarding the same thing with Mr. Collins in the past. I ask him if he owned the property, and he told me he was cleaning it up for the owner. I then ask him where the dumpster went that was there yesterday. He said he again was cleaning it up for someone.

Mr. Collins has had a problem understanding the rules of burning in the city limits in the past. He became short with me and I also was with him. Officer Fort, Officer Graskewicz as well as officer Howard arrived on scene at the request of Craig Lemmon. I ask them to write him a ticket for violating the city ordinance regarding burning and Officer Howard more or less stated that my commissioner had to do this. Comissioner Sailliez was also on scene and told them to write it. Mr. Collins was then ask to come to the police station with Officer Fort. I stayed on scene of the fire and was requested to come to the police department to sign the complaint, and I did.
