ORDER OF THE BOARD (by G.T.Girard):

On November 12, 2009, Cancer Treatment Centers of America, Inc. (Cancer Treatment Centers) timely filed a petition asking the Board to review an October 9, 2009, determination of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency). *See* 415 ILCS 5/40(a)(1) (2008)¹; 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(b), 105.402, 105.404. The Agency's determination concerns Cancer Treatment Centers' underground storage tank (UST) site at 2414 North Sheridan Road, Zion, Lake County. For reasons below, the Board accepts Cancer Treatment Centers' petition for hearing.

Under the Environmental Protection Act (Act) (415 ILCS 5 (2008)), the Agency decides whether to approve proposed cleanup plans and budgets for leaking UST sites, as well as requests for cleanup cost reimbursement from the State's UST Fund, which consists of UST fees and motor fuel taxes. If the Agency disapproves or modifies a submittal, the UST owner or operator may appeal the decision to the Board. *See* 415 ILCS 5/40(a)(1), 57-57.17 (2008); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.Subpart D. In this case, the Agency rejected Cancer Treatment Centers' request for reimbursement from the UST Fund for the Zion UST site. Cancer Treatment Centers appeals on the grounds that Cancer Treatment Centers relied on a statement by Sue Dwyer of the Office of the Illinois State Fire Marshall (OSFM), who said that an additional filing number was not needed for the removed UST, even though the UST had been discovered more than 59 days after the January 8, 2008, discovery of soil contamination on the site. Cancer Treatment Centers' petition meets the content requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.408.

The Board accepts the petition for hearing. Cancer Treatment Centers has the burden of proof. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.112(a). Hearings will be based exclusively on the record before the Agency at the time the Agency issued its determination. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.412. Accordingly, though the Board hearing affords petitioner the opportunity to challenge the Agency's reasons for its decision, information developed after the Agency's decision

typically is not admitted at hearing or considered by the Board. *See Alton Packaging Corp. v. PCB*, 162 Ill. App. 3d 731, 738, 516 N.E.2d 275, 280 (5th Dist. 1987); *Community Landfill Co. & City of Morris v. IEPA*, PCB 01-170 (Dec. 6, 2001), *aff'd sub nom. Community Landfill Co. & City of Morris v. PCB & IEPA*, 331 Ill. App. 3d 1056, 772 N.E.2d 231 (3rd Dist. 2002).

Hearings will be scheduled and completed in a timely manner, consistent with the decision deadline (*see* 415 ILCS 5/40(a)(2) (2006)), which only Cancer Treatment Centers may extend by waiver (*see* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.308). If the Board fails to take final action by the decision deadline, Cancer Treatment Centers may deem its request granted. *See* 415 ILCS 5/40(a)(2) (2006). Currently, the decision deadline is March 9, 2010, which is the 120th day after the date on which the Board received the petition, November 12, 2009. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.114. The Board meeting immediately before the decision deadline is scheduled for March 4, 2010.

Unless the Board or the hearing officer orders otherwise, the Agency must file the entire record of its determination by December 9, 2009, which is 30 days after the Board received Cancer Treatment Centers' petition. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.410(a). If the Agency wishes to seek additional time to file the record, it must file a request for extension before the date on which the record is due to be filed. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.116. The record must comply with the content requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.410(b).

IT IS SO ORDERED.
