- MR. FOX: Good morning and welcome to
- this Illinois Pollution Control Board hearing. My
- name is Tim Fox, and I am the hearing officer for
- 4 this rulemaking proceeding, which is entitled, In
- 5 the matter of Reasonably Available Control
- 6 Technology, RACT -- pronounced RACT -- for volatile
- organic material emissions from group to consumer
- and commercial products, proposed amendments to
- 9 35 Illinois Administrative Code 211, 218, and 219.
- I want to introduce, also present
- 11 from the board today, the following: At my
- immediate right is Board Member Andrea S. Moore, who
- is the board member assigned to this rulemaking. To
- 14 her right is the board's acting chair,
- Dr. G. Tanner Girard. To my far left is Board
- 16 Member Gary Blankenship, and at my immediate left is
- Anand Rao of the Board's technical unit. We are
- 18 expecting also to see Board Member Carrie Zalewski
- 19 -- spelled Z-a-l-e-w-s-k-i -- who has let us know
- that the inclement weather has delayed her a moment
- 21 or two.
- Moving on, the board docket number
- for this rulemaking is R10-8. The Illinois
- 24 Environmental Protection Agency, IEPA, filed this

- 1 proposal on July 9th of 2009. And in an order dated
- 2 August 6th of 2009, the Board accepted the Agency's
- 3 proposal for hearing. Please note that on
- 4 September 14th of 2009 the IEPA filed a motion to
- 5 amend its proposal. The Board granted that motion,
- 6 which was unopposed, in an order dated October 15th
- 7 of 2009.
- Also, please note that the IEPA,
- 9 yesterday on December 7th of 2009, filed with the
- Board a second motion to amend its rulemaking
- 11 proposal. Under the Board's procedural rules, that
- motion opens a 14-day response period, and the Board
- itself will address the substance of that motion at
- 14 a later date.
- Today we are holding the second
- hearing in this rulemaking. The first took place on
- October 27th, 2009, in Edwardsville, Madison County,
- 18 Illinois. In an order dated October 28th of 2009,
- 19 the hearing officer directed participants wishing to
- 20 pre-file testimony for this second hearing to do so
- 21 no later than November 17th of 2009. The same order
- directed participants to pre-file questions based on
- that pre-filed testimony no later than December 3rd,
- 24 2009.

- 1 The record in this docket shows
- that no participant has pre-filed testimony or
- questions for this hearing. If any participant does
- wish to provide testimony today, there is a sign-up
- 5 sheet and pens just inside the door of this room
- 6 adjacent to the court reporter. Like any witnesses
- 7 who had pre-filed testimony, those who had not done
- 8 so would be sworn and would be subject to questions
- 9 about their testimony.
- I can see clearly those sign-up
- sheets do not reflect that any person wishes to
- offer testimony, and there is no one present this
- morning, other than members of the Board, the Board
- staff, or representatives of the Agency. Without
- pre-filed testimony, we would begin with testimony
- by those who did not pre-file it. However, that is
- a moot point in the absence of anyone indicating
- that they wish to do so.
- We would then customarily turn to
- questions on the part of those who had not pre-filed
- them, but Mr. Rao of the Board's technical staff
- 22 assures me that he has no additional questions after
- the first hearing, and consequently we do not have
- 24 anyone present who wishes to ask additional

- 1 questions of the Agency about its amended proposal.
- 2 As time would permit, after the
- 3 conclusion of any testimony or questions,
- 4 participants may, of course, offer public comment.
- 5 My intention this morning is in the absence of any
- 6 pre-filed testimony or other oral testimony or
- questions, simply to go off the record in a moment
- 8 or two, because we are having inclement weather that
- 9 would allow anyone who was delayed to assure that
- they could take part if they did wish to offer any
- 11 testimony or ask any questions.
- Just for the record, this
- proceeding is governed by the Board's procedural
- rules, all information that is relevant and that is
- not repetitious or privileged will be admitted into
- 16 the record. And in the event that the board members
- or board staff do have any questions, those are
- intended solely to help develop a clear and complete
- 19 record for the board's ultimate decision, and do not
- 20 reflect any judgment or conclusion regarding the
- 21 proposal.
- Before we, as I had indicated, do
- go off the record for a short time, is there any
- question at all about the proceedings?

- 1 Ms. Vetterhoffer, it's probably appropriate, just
- for the record, for you to identify those
- 3 representatives of the Agency are present. And if
- 4 this is an appropriate time to do that, please feel
- 5 free to go ahead.
- 6 MS. VETTERHOFFER: I'm Dana
- 7 Vetterhoffer with the Illinois EPA.
- MR. BLOOMBERG: I am David Blumberg,
- 9 compliance unit manager of the Bureau of Air,
- 10 Illinois EPA.
- MR. FOX: And having taken care of
- some of those introductory matters, let's go off the
- record and resume in 15 minutes.
- 14 (Whereupon, a discussion was had
- off the record.)
- MR. FOX: Thank you, first of all, for
- everyone's patience in going off the record. We
- have not had anyone else physically appear who might
- wish to offer any testimony or pose any questions,
- and the sign-up sheet that was left available for
- 21 anyone who might wish to offer testimony remains
- 22 blank. So clearly there was no one interested in
- 23 addressing the substance of the Agency's amended
- 24 proposal or their motion to amend that that was

- 1 filed yesterday on December 7th.
- I do want to move onto the issue
- off an economic impact study. Since 1998,
- 4 Section 27-B of the Environmental Protection Act has
- 5 required that the Board request that the department,
- 6 now known as the Department of Commerce and Economic
- Opportunity, or DCEO, conduct an economic impact
- 8 study of proposed rules before the Board adopts
- 9 rules. The Board must make either the economic
- impact study or the Department's explanation for not
- 11 conducting one available to the public at least
- 12 20 days before a hearing.
- In a letter dated August 6th,
- 14 2009, the Board, through acting chairman, Dr.
- 15 Girard, requested that DCEO conduct that economic
- impact study on this proposal, and to date the Board
- has received nothing from DCEO responding to that
- 18 request. Is there anyone who would like to testify
- or otherwise offer comment regarding the request
- 20 from the board to DCEO?
- Neither seeing nor hearing any
- interest in doing so, I do want the record to
- 23 reflect that Board Member Carrie Zalewski has
- 24 arrived and is seated next to Dr. Girard.

- I also want to address, before we
- adjourn, the issue of filing post-hearing comments.
- Before it takes any action on the Agency's amended
- 4 proposal, the Board will hold open a post-hearing
- 5 comment ending on Monday, December 28th. The board
- 6 does expect to receive the transcript by Friday,
- December 11th, while the 14-day comment period would
- 8 customarily run until Friday, December 25th. That
- 9 is, of course, Christmas Day, and a state holiday,
- which will push that 14-day deadline until the
- 11 following Monday, the 28th.
- I will issue a hearing officer
- order very shortly that clarifies, for the record
- and for any participants, that those comments would
- be due on that date of Monday, December 28th.
- 16 Again, the copies of the transcript are expected to
- be available to the Board by Friday, December 11th,
- 18 2009. And once it is filed with the Board, that
- 19 transcript will be available very quickly on the
- 20 Board's website.
- In addition, for the record,
- 22 anyone may file written public comments in this
- rulemaking with the clerk. The Board comments may
- be filed electronically through the Board's clerk's

- office on line or COOL, C-O-O-L. Any questions
- 2 about electronic filing through COOL should be
- directed to the clerk's office.
- 4 And finally, any filings with the
- Board, whether paper or electronic, must also be
- 6 served on the hearing officer, and all persons or
- 7 entities on the service list. And again, before
- filing with the clerk, please contact the clerk's
- 9 office to ensure that you have the most recent
- version of the service list.
- 11 If anyone has questions about
- 12 procedural aspects of the rulemaking, they may
- 13 always reach me, as the hearing officer, through the
- 14 contact information that is listed on the Board's
- website.
- For the record also, no other
- hearings are now scheduled in this rulemaking, and
- the Board would not expect to schedule any
- 19 additional hearings.
- 20 Are there matters of any kind that
- 21 any of the participants would like to address on the
- record before we adjourn? Seeing no hands or any
- indication that there are questions, I certainly
- would like to thank the Agency for their travel to
