JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2008).

FACTS

- 1. That James and Patricia Quisenberry are the current owner and operator ("Respondents") of a facility located in Section 3, Township 20 North, Range 1 West of the Third Principal Meridian, Logan County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Oran Township/Quisenberry.
- 2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 1078120004.
 - That Respondents have owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on August 24, 2010, Mark Weber of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Springfield Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy

of his inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 10-13-10, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7007 0220 0000 0152 3700

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Mark Weber during the course of his August 24, 2010 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondents have violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2008).
- (2) That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in open burning, a violation of Section 21(p)(3) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3) (2008).
- (3) That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in used tires, at this site, not altered, covered or otherwise prevented from accumulating water, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2008).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2008), Respondents are subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00)</u>. If Respondents elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>November 15, 2010</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2008), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondents shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2008), if Respondents fail to petition or elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondents shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondents from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondents in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondents have the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2008). If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondents shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondents.

On August 24, 2010 Mr. Mark Weber, Division of Land Pollution Control/Field Operations Section (DLPC/FOS) - Springfield Regional Office (SRO), conducted an inspection of the Quisenberry site in rural Logan County. A re-inspection of the site was conducted when Mr. Weber noticed a significant amount of open dumped waste at the property while conducting an inspection of another site in the area.

The Quisenberry site had been subject to Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) inspections in the past due to open dumping at the property. An Administrative Citation Warning Notice (ACWN) had been sent to the owner/operator as a result of the initial site inspection. The responsible party responded to the ACWN and ultimately removed the open dumped wastes. As a result of the responsible party's clean-up of the site a Return To Compliance (RTC) letter dated November 8, 2006 was issued, and the violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act that had been cited were considered resolved. It is clear, based upon observations made during the August 24, 2010 inspection that the open dumping of waste has resumed at the site.

The site is located in an unincorporated area of Logan County approximately 5 miles due east of Lawndale, Illinois along the south side of 2032nd Street. Legally and specifically the property is located in Section 3, Township 20 North, Range 1 West of the Third Principal Meridian, Logan County, Illinois. The legal description was derived from a Warranty Deed filed on July 12, 1976 and obtained from the Logan County Recorder's Office. The owners on the deed are listed as James Harold Quisenberry, Jr. & Patricia Quisenberry of Lincoln, Illinois. The Quisenberry's mailing address is listed as 635 North Sherman in Lincoln, Illinois. This inspector returned to Lincoln to confirm that Mr. & Mrs. Quisenberry still own the property. According to the Logan County Recorder's Office there is no more recent deed available that would indicate ownership of the property has changed. A 2010 Parcel Information Report obtained from the Logan County Assessor's Office indicates that James Quisenberry is still the tax payer of record for the property. A copy of the Parcel Information Report is attached. Please refer to the attached aerial photograph for a depiction of the site location.

August 24, 2010 Inspection

The August 24, 2010 IEPA inspection of the Quisenberry site took place between 0930 and 0945 hours. The temperature was approximately 70° F. The skies were mostly cloudy with a 5-10 mile per hour east wind. Soil conditions were dry. There is no residence at the property, nor were any site representative present for the site inspection.

As indicated above, the IEPA inspector was conducting an inspection of another site in the area when he observed a significant volume of open dumped wastes at the Quisenberry site. The open dumped wastes at the site are not clearly visible from the entrance to the property along 2032nd Street which abuts the property to the north. The wastes were open dumped and scattered at the back of the property, or the southern half of the lot. Open dumped wastes observed on-site included furniture, white goods, plastics, dimensional lumber, automotive parts, electronics, unmarked drums and other containers containing liquids, electronics, concrete block, paper, landscape debris and mixed metals.

Some of the wastes were consolidated in waste piles, while others were scattered around the site. One of the waste piles was composed primarily of different types of air conditioning units. Another particular waste pile of note was composed of furniture, dimensional lumber, paper, and plastics. It was obvious that wastes had been burned at this location at some time in the past as ash was visually observed in this area. Partially burned items in this area such as mattresses/box springs observed as well. This area of the site is devoid of vegetative cover as if it had all been burned away.

Also located on-site are no less than 200 used tires, both on and off rim. Most of the used tires are stored within a semi trailer and some are covered with a tarp, but there are a number of improperly stored and open dumped tires on-site that were either in loose piles, others were stacked, or they were found singly throughout the site. At least one of the tires was observed to holding water. It is important to note that in 2006 the party responsible for clean-up of this site had voluntarily entered into a Consensual Removal Agreement (CRA) with the IEPA to have used tires removed.

There are also approximately 20 abandoned vehicles at the site. Most, if not all of them, appear to have been in damaged in an accident at one time and are clearly inoperable. The volume of open dumped waste has been estimated at 200 cubic yards. This estimate excludes the abandoned vehicles and used tires. Please refer to the attached photographs taken during the August 24, 2010 inspection for depictions of the wastes located on-site.

Photograph #1 provides a view of some of the abandoned vehicles and auto parts at the Quisenberry site.

Photograph #2 shows some more of the abandoned vehicles at the Quisenberry site.

Photograph #3 is of an area of the site where it appears that items that have recyclable value have been segregated. There are metal siding, white goods, and A/C units in this area of the site.

Photograph #4 shows some of the A/C units at the site. Some drums/containers of lubricants are in the foreground. There are also containers with unidentified fluids in the trailer as well as electronic equipment.

Photograph #5 is of a trailer filled with used tires. There are also used tires under the tarp. It appeared that most of the tires are on a rim however there are some that are off rim.

Photograph #6 depicts an area of the Quisenberry site where it was evident that open burning has been taking place. There are partially burned materials in this area, ash on the ground, and the ground cover has been burned away.

Photograph #7 shows landscape waste piled in the vicinity of the open burn area. It is unclear if the landscape waste was generated on-site or was hauled to the site.


Photograph #8 depicts a partially burned box spring or mattress in the open burn area at the Quisenberry site. Some ash can be seen in the top center of the photo. All of the vegetative cover has been burned away in this area as well.

Photograph #9 documents an off rim used tire holding water.

The August 24, 2010 site inspection was conducted in order to determine if violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act exist at the Quisenberry site. It was determined that violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act do indeed exist. Violations of the Act include Sections: 9(a), 9(c), 21(a), 21(d)(1), 21(d)(2), 21(e), 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), 55(a)(1), and 55(k)(1). Apparent violations of the Regulations, 35 Illinois Administrative Code include Section 812.101(a). Refer to the attached Open Dump Checklist for additional information.

The IEPA inspector concluded the inspection of the Quisenberry site around 0945 and resumed his inspection of the other site in the area.


