- 1 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Good afternoon,
- everyone, and welcome to this Illinois Pollution
- 3 Control Board hearing. My name is Tim Fox and I
- 4 am the hearing officer for this rulemaking. This
- is entitled, "In The Matter of Revision of Enhanced
- 6 Vehicle Emission Inspections and Maintenance (I/M)
- 7 Regulations, Amendments to 35 Illinois
- 8 Administrative Code 240."
- 9 I first want to introduce as also
- being present from the Board at my immediate left
- is Board member Andrea Moore, the lead Board member
- for this proceeding. At my far right is Board
- member Carrie Zalewski and to my right next to her
- is Board member Gary Blankenship. Also present at
- my immediate right is Anand Rao, of the Board's
- 16 technical staff.
- 17 The Board's docket number
- for this rulemaking is R11-19. The Illinois
- 19 Environmental Protection Agency filed this
- rulemaking proposal on December 8, 2010, and in
- an order dated December 16, 2010, the Board
- accepted the Agency's proposal for hearing, granted
- the Agency's request for a waiver of specified
- copy and filing requirements and directed the

- Board's clerk to publish this as a proposal for
- public comment and the proposal appeared in the
- 3 Illinois Register on January 3, 2011, at 35
- 4 Illinois Register 129.
- 5 On December 16, 2010, a hearing
- officer order scheduled two hearings; the first on
- February 2, 2011, in Chicago, and February 23rd in
- 8 Edwardsville. The order also set a deadline of
- January 19, 2011, to pre-file testimony for the
- 10 first hearing and pursuant to that order, the
- 11 Agency, on January 18, 2011, pre-filed the testimony
- of Mr. Michael Hills. No other participant
- pre-filed testimony for this, the first hearing.
- On February 2, 2011, severe
- winter weather caused state offices, including the
- Board, to close. Accordingly, the hearing officer
- convened the first hearing on the next business day,
- February 3, 2011, at 1:00 p.m., but continued it
- on the record to this date and time without
- 20 accepting testimony or comment.
- This proceeding, as we go forward
- is, of course, governed by the Board's procedural
- 23 rules. All information that is relevant and is not
- repetitious or privileged will be admitted into the

- 1 record. Please note that any questions by the
- 2 Board's staff or Board members are intended solely
- 3 to develop a record that's clear and complete and
- 4 do not reflect any prejudgment of the proposal.
- In speaking with Mr. Mohr briefly
- 6 before the hearing, it was clear that the Agency's
- 7 intent was to begin the hearing with Mr. Hill's
- 8 pre-filed testimony. It's my understanding that
- 9 the Agency would also like to swear in Mr. Thorpe
- so that he would be available in the event that
- his input is helpful in answering any questions.
- Under Section 102.424(f) of the
- Board's procedural rules, the pre-filed testimony
- is entered into the record as if read and we could
- begin by proceeding immediately to questions that
- participants may have on the basis of that
- testimony. After those, we can turn to the
- testimony of any witness who did not pre-file for
- this hearing, but would like to testify here today.
- 20 At the end of the table at which
- the Agency personnel are seated is a signup sheet
- so that anyone who would like testify may indicate
- that they would like to do so at this hearing.
- 24 Of course, for the court

- 1 reporter transcribing today's proceeding, please
- speak clearly. We shouldn't have any trouble
- making ourselves heard here, but if you would avoid
- 4 speaking at the same time as any other person, I
- 5 know that she would appreciate that for the sake
- 6 of clarity.
- Do we have any questions about
- 8 the very simple proceedings going forward? Very
- good. Neither seeing nor hearing any, Mr. Mohr,
- 10 I think we've reached the point where we could
- swear in the two Agency witnesses that I had
- referred to and get underway.
- MR. MOHR: I'm fine with that.
- 14 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Very good.
- 15 (Mr. Hill sworn.)
- 16 (Mr. Thorpe sworn.)
- MR. MOHR: At this time, I would
- like to move to have Mr. Hill's pre-filed testimony
- entered into the record as an exhibit into the
- proceedings, which would be Exhibit 1.
- HEARING OFFICER FOX: And you have a
- 22 copy of that?
- MR. MOHR: I have a copy of that.
- 24 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Okay. Very

- can begin with the substance of the Agency's
- 2 presentation. If you have a brief introduction that
- you or Mr. Hills would like to make, we can proceed
- 4 to that or go immediately to questions as you
- 5 prefer.
- MR. MOHR: Okay. I'll start.
- 7 Members of the Board and
- 8 Hearing Officer Fox, thank you for having us here
- 9 today. My name is Ken Mohr and I'm an attorney
- for the Illinois EPA, Bureau of Air.
- 11 As we briefly -- Mr. Fox briefly
- mentioned the Agency filed this rulemaking to update
- its vehicle inspection and maintenance emission
- testing standards simply to be consistent with the
- vehicle emissions inspection law of 2005 as amended.
- 16 It's also referred to as the veil, V-E-I-L, of 2005
- 17 625 ILCS 5/13(c).
- The Vehicle Emissions Inspection
- Law of 2005 was enacted in 2005, passed by the
- 20 Illinois legislature and amended thereafter. As
- 21 it pertains to this rulemaking, the veil of 2005
- exempted pre-1986 vehicles from the testing
- requirement and dropped the transient loaded mode
- or I/M 240 emissions test.

- Before we get to witnesses and
- testimony, I would like to just note for the record
- that JCAR's first notice version, which was filed
- on January 20th of 2001, contains a scriveners error
- 5 at Section 240.102 in the definition preconditioning
- 6 mode. In the first line of that definition, the
- 7 terms "loaded mode or" should be struck.
- 8 That scriveners error does not
- 9 appear in the Illinois Register version of the
- proposed rule. I would like to request that the
- 11 Board address that scriveners error and JCAR have
- that corrected going forward.
- 13 As we mentioned, I have today
- with me two witnesses, Michael Hills from the
- 15 Technical Services Section of the Division of
- 16 Mobile Source Programs within the Bureau of Air
- of the Illinois EPA and Steven Thorpe, Manager
- 18 Compliance Assurance in the Division of Mobile
- 19 Source Programs within the Bureau of Air of the
- 20 Illinois EPA. They are here to answer any questions
- that might be asked of them.
- We have already handled the
- issue of the pre-filed testimony. Mr. Thorpe did
- not obviously file pre-filed testimony. He is

- here to answer any questions as necessary.
- 2 At this time we can move to
- any questions of Mr. Hills. He does not have
- 4 any comments before we get started with that.
- 5 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Very good,
- 6 Mr. Mohr. Thank you for your comments. We can
- 7 certainly turn to any questions that any of you
- 8 present may have of the Agency.
- 9 Before posing your first
- question, just for the benefit of the record,
- please identify yourself by name and by any
- organization you may represent, that would be
- very helpful at this point.
- Does anyone have a question that
- they wish to pose to Mr. Hills on the basis of
- 16 his testimony?
- Neither see nor hear any
- questions on the part of anyone who is present.
- Do any of the Board members or any of the Board
- staff have any questions that they wish to pose
- toMr. Hills on the basis of his testimony?
- MS. MOORE: It's pretty clear.
- HEARING OFFICER FOX: Neither seeing
- nor hearing any questions on the part of the Board,

- why don't we go off or the record for just a moment.
- 2 (Whereupon, a discussion
- was had off the record.)
- 4 HEARING OFFICER FOX: In going off
- of the record to address some procedural issues,
- 6 we took up a couple of matters pertaining to this
- 7 hearing.
- First of all, the copies of the
- 9 transcript of today's hearing are expected to be
- available at the Board by Monday, February 14, 2011.
- 11 Very soon after that, the Board will post that
- transcript, the document, to the Board's web site
- and it will be listed under the docket number, of
- 14 course, R11-19.
- The second hearing has been
- scheduled and will take place as scheduled on
- Wednesday, February 23, 2011. That is at 9:00
- a.m. in Edwardsville at the Madison County
- 19 Administration Building, with deadline of Wednesday,
- February 16th of 2011 to pre-file testimony for
- that second hearing.
- Because that is a short amount
- of time before the day of hearing, the, quote,
- mailbox rule, unquote, at Section 101.300 of the

- Board's procedural rules will not apply so that
- the clerk's office must receive that pre-filed
- 3 testimony on or before the close of business on
- 4 February 16th.
- 5 Anyone, of course, may file
- 6 written public comments in this rulemaking with
- 7 the clerk of the Board. Those comments may
- be filed electronically through the clerk's office
- 9 online. Any questions about electronic filing
- should be directed to the office of the Board's
- 11 clerk.
- Filings with the Board, whether
- paper or electronic, must also be served on the
- hearing officer and on those entities on the service
- list. Before filing, I would ask that you please
- check with the Board's clerk to ensure that you have
- the most recent and complete version of the service
- 18 list. If anyone has questions about the procedural
- 19 aspects of this rulemaking, my contact information
- is listed plainly on the Board's web site.
- Mr. Mohr, I believe you had one
- other issue you wish to take up before we adjourned
- this hearing today.
- MR. MOHR: Yes. The joint committee

- on this rulemaking has filed a requested and
- economic and budgetary analysis pursuant to the
- 3 Illinois Administrate Procedure Act at Section
- 4 5-40(c).
- 5 The Agency believes that the
- 6 response to this economic and budgetary analysis
- 7 is not required pursuant to the Vehicle Emissions
- 8 Inspection Law of 2005 at Section 13c-20(a). That
- 9 subsection specifically states that the rulemaking
- 10 provisions of the Illinois Administrate Procedure
- 11 Act did not apply to rules adopted under that
- 12 subsection.
- These vehicle emissions inspection
- rules will be adopted and have been filed under
- that subsection. The section of the Illinois
- Administrate Procedure Act cited by JCAR 5-40(c)
- is entitled, "General Rulemaking," and, thus, the
- 18 Agency believes that because this filing has been
- made under Section 13c-20(a), the economic and
- 20 budgetary analysis requested by JCAR does not
- 21 apply as it is requested under the general
- rulemaking provisions of the Administrative
- Procedure Act, which do not apply.
- However, should the Board choose

- to respond to the economic and budgetary analysis
- 2 requested by JCAR, the Agency has no objection to
- 3 that and will cooperate fully with whatever
- information that the Board needs to that end.
- 5 That's it.
- 6 HEARING OFFICER FOX: Very good.
- <sup>7</sup> Mr. Mohr, thank you for clarifying the record.
- 8 Certainly on the Board's behalf, I appreciate
- 9 your closing statement of availability to help
- with any information the Board might consider
- 11 necessary to perform.
- 12 With that, I think we have
- closed our business for this first hearing.
- 14 Are there any questions before we do adjourn?
- <sup>15</sup> Questions of any nature?
- Neither seeing nor hearing
- any, Mr. Mohr, and all of you who are present
- from the Agency, I appreciate your travel on a
- very cold day under fairly arguous conditions,
- $^{20}$  and for your attention to this matter. With
- that, we are adjourned. Thank you very much.
- MR. MOHR: Thank you to the Board
- for holding this hearing.
