**Merit Scholarship Program.** Although Leasure and Cole will not continue in the 2012 competition for National Merit Scholarships, Commended Students placed among the top 5 percent of more than 1.5 million students who entered the 2012 competition by taking the 2010 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).

Pollution Variance

ExxonMobil Oil Corporation ("ExxonMobil") located on a site adjacent to Interstate 55 at the Arsenal Road exit in Channahon Township in unincorporated Will County filed with the Illinois Pollution Control Board ("Board"), a petition for variance on May 18, 2011 (PCB 2011-086) under Title IX of the Environmental Protection Act ("Act") [415 ILCS 5/35-38]. The Board has the authority pursuant to Section 5/35 of the Act [415 ILCS 5/35] and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104 to grant a variance. On September 2, 2011, ExxonMobil filed with the Board an amended petition for variance, or in the alternative, new petition for variance (PCB 2012-046), which was substantially similar to the original petition filed with the Board, but for the recently modified compliance date of the underlying regulation at issue. On September 8, 2011, the Board accepted the filing as a new petition, and on its own motion, consolidated PCB 2011-086 and PCB 2012-046 for hearing and decision. ExxonMobil requests a variance from the January 1, 2015, deadline for compliance with the applicable nitrogen oxides emissions requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 217, Subparts A, D, E, and F. The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency filed its recommendation on August 18, 2011, and amended recommendation, or in the alternative, recommendation on September 7, 2011. A hearing was held in Bolingbrook on September 19, 2011. A copy of the variance petitions and recommendations may be obtained through the Clerk's Office at the Board. The Board's office address is Illinois Pollution Control Board, James R. Thompson Center, 100 West Randolph Street, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601 (telephone: 312/814-3620). Public comments must be filed on or before October 11, 2011, and should be submitted to the Board at the address specified above. The record closes on October 24, 2011, and is available at the Board office for inspection, except those portions that are protected from disclosure under 35 Ill. Adm. Code 130. Procedures are available whereby disclosure may be sought by the public.
