PRE-FILED QUESTIONS OF JOHN E. HOCK, JAMES E. HUFF AND GREGORY WILCOX SUBMITTED BY WASTE MANAGEMENT OF ILLINOIS, INC.

WASTE MANAGEMENT OF ILLINOIS, INC. hereby files, in accordance with the Hearing Officer Order issued on August 15, 2011, its questions for John E. Hock, P.E., of Civil & Environmental Consultants, Inc. (CEC) representing the Illinois Association of Aggregate Producers, James E. Huff, P.E., of Huff & Huff, Inc., representing a number of governmental authorities responsible for transportation infrastructure, and Gregory Wilcox, representing Land Reclamation & Recycling Association.

Questions for John E. Hock

- 1. How many CCDD fill sites are currently operating?
- 2. How many of these sites did CEC do borings at and collect samples from?
- 3. How many soil fill sites are currently operating?
- 4. How many soil fill sites did CEC do borings at and collection samples from?
- 5. Is it true that Public Act 96-1416 will likely result in more soil from remediation projects being disposed of at CCDD and fill sites than at landfills?
- 6. How many CCDD sites have installed groundwater monitoring systems?
- 7. How many soil fill sites have installed groundwater monitoring systems?
- 8. Without an active monitoring system at these sites, isn't it impossible to know whether these sites have impacted the groundwater in the past?

Questions for James E. Huff

- 1. Other than the one CCDD facility where monitoring wells were installed, as indicated on pages 4-6 of your testimony, are you aware of any other CCDD or soil fill site where groundwater monitoring has taken place?
- 2. Isn't your testimony that TACO can be applied to the management of contamination at CCDD sites (page 4 of your testimony) inconsistent with the Board's December 4, 1997 Opinion and Order in the TACO rulemaking (R97-12B)?
- 3. Are you aware of any CCDD or soil fill sites that have accepted waste in violation of the Environmental Protection Act?

Questions for Gregory Wilcox

- 1. Doesn't the Lynwood site's acceptance of waste substantiate the Agency's recommendation that CCDD and soil fill operations have groundwater monitoring programs?
- 2. Isn't it true that CCDD sites other than the Lynwood site have accepted waste in violation of the Environmental Protection Act?
