ORDER OF THE BOARD (by T. A. Holbrook):

On January 20, 2012, Quick Oil Company (Quick Oil) timely filed a petition asking the Board to review a December 20, 2011, determination of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency). *See* 415 ILCS 5/40(a)(1) (2010); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.300(b), 105.402, 105.404. The Agency's determination concerns Quick Oil's leaking underground storage tank (UST) site located at 400 East Hickory, Canton, Fulton County. For the reasons below, the Board accepts Quick Oil's petition for hearing.

Under the Environmental Protection Act (Act) (415 ILCS 5 (2010)), the Agency decides whether to approve proposed cleanup plans and budgets for leaking UST sites, as well as requests for cleanup cost reimbursement from the State's UST Fund, which consists of UST fees and motor fuel taxes. If the Agency disapproves or modifies a submittal, the UST owner or operator may appeal the decision to the Board. *See* 415 ILCS 5/40(a)(1), 57-57.17 (2010); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.Subpart D. In this case, the Agency denied Quick Oil's full request for reimbursement from the UST Fund by assessing two deductibles of \$10,000.00 each. Quick Oil appeals on the grounds that the Agency erred in assessing the two deductibles for two UST release incidents because only one deductible applies per UST site under Section 57.8)(a)(4) of the Act and because the second incident was a re-reporting of the first incident. Quick Oil's petition meets the content requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.408.

The Board accepts the petition for hearing. Quick Oil has the burden of proof. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.112(a). Hearings will be based exclusively on the record before the Agency at the time the Agency issued its determination. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.412. Accordingly, though the Board hearing affords petitioner the opportunity to challenge the Agency's reasons for its decision, information developed after the Agency's decision typically is not admitted at hearing or considered by the Board. *See* Alton Packaging Corp. v. PCB, 162 Ill. App. 3d 731, 738, 516 N.E.2d 275, 280 (5th Dist. 1987); Community Landfill Co. & City of Morris v. IEPA, PCB 01-170 (Dec. 6, 2001), *aff'd sub nom. Community Landfill Co. & City of Morris v. PCB & IEPA*, 331 Ill. App. 3d 1056, 772 N.E.2d 231 (3rd Dist. 2002).

Hearings will be scheduled and completed in a timely manner, consistent with the decision deadline (*see* 415 ILCS 5/40(a)(2) (2010)), which only Quick Oil may extend by waiver (*see* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.308). If the Board fails to take final action by the decision deadline, Quick Oil may deem its request granted. *See* 415 ILCS 5/40(a)(2) (2010). Currently, the decision deadline is May 21, 2012, which is the first business day after the 120th day after the date on which the Board received the petition, January 20, 2012. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.114. The Board meeting immediately before the decision deadline is scheduled for May 17, 2012.

Unless the Board or the hearing officer orders otherwise, the Agency must file the entire record of its determination by February 20, 2012, which is the first business day after 30 days after the Board received Quick Oil's petition. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.410(a). If the Agency wishes to seek additional time to file the record, it must file a request for extension before the date on which the record is due to be filed. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.116. The record must comply with the content requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.410(b).
