JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010).

FACTS

- 1. That Louis K. Niemeyer is the current owner ("Respondent") of a facility located at 1321 South 19th Street, Mattoon, Coles County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Mattoon/Niemeyer, Louis.
- 2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 0298060004.
 - 3. That Respondent has owned said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on February 16, 2012, Jennifer O'Hearn of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Champaign Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of her inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 4-12, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7009 2820 0001 7496 0759

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Jennifer O'Hearn during the course of her February 16, 2012 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2010).
- (2) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in deposition of general construction or demolition debris: or clean construction or demolition debris, a violation of Section 21(p)(7) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7) (2010).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2010), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>April 30, 2012</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution

Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2010), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2010). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

OPEN DUMP REINSPECTION

Site History:

The original inspection of the site was conducted on November 10, 2010. The site exhibited evidence of open dumping of asphalt, concrete, brick, dimensional lumber, etc. The waste was piled up in various locations over much of the property which is a large partially abandoned industrial lot. An ACWN was sent on December 15, 2010. A response was received on December 28, 2010. An email with photos of the dimensional lumber pile waste inside of roll-off containers was received on April 1, 2011. A reinspection was conducted on May 3, 2011 in which the pile of dimensional lumber and other non-clean demolition debris was observed to be removed from the site. The other piles of mainly asphalt, concrete and brick, etc. still remained at the site. On May 5, 2011 receipts were received for the roll-off containers that were the subject of the April 1, 2011 email's photos.

Assessor's Office GIS website

I went to the Coles County Tax Assessor's Office GIS website to confirm ownership for the site. The property was listed under Parcel # 07-1-00847-000 and Parcel # 07-1-00848-000. Parcel # 07-1-00847-000 is listed as taxes paid to 8010 Louis Lane, Mattoon, Illinois, 61938 for a 24.72 acre parcel located at 1321 S. 19th St., in Mattoon, Illinois in Section 23 Range Block 7 Legal TWP 12. Parcel # 07-1-00848-000 is listed as taxes paid in care of, "(%)", Don Hance, 1013 S. 19th St., Mattoon, Illinois, 61938 for a 0.94 acre parcel located at 1013 S. 19th St., in Mattoon, Illinois in Section 23 Range Block 7 Legal TWP 12.

Open Dump Inspection Narrative

Jennifer O'Hearn of DLPC/FOS Champaign Regional Office conducted a routine open dump inspection of the above referenced facility on February 16, 2012. This inspection was conducted to determine the regulatory status and evaluate compliance with the Environmental Protection Act (Act) and Title 35 Illinois Administrative Code, Subtitle G: Land Pollution (Regulations). The weather was partly cloudy, with the temperature around 42 degrees, and a 10-15 mph wind out of the west. Eight photos and no samples

were taken. No one was present to represent the property owner. The site is located at 1321 S. 19th St. in the city of Mattoon in Coles County, Illinois. Waste is scattered around the site.

I arrived at about 12:38 P.M. and parked inside the entrance off of 19th Street on the northeast corner of the site. After exiting my vehicle I walked to the southeast about twenty-five yards for a view of the asphalt piles from the east just inside the entrance as seen in previous two inspections with no apparent change (photo 1). I walked about 250 yards to the southwest and viewed the concrete and brick pile area from the northeast as seen in the previous two inspections, with no apparent change (photo 2). Next, I walked about twenty-five to thirty yards to the northwest for another view of the concrete and brick pile area as seen in previous two inspections with no apparent change (photos 3 & 4). Then I walked around forty-five to fifty yards to the southwest for view of the concrete and brick pile area from the west, as seen in previous two inspections with no apparent change (photo 5). I then walked about thirty to thirty-five yards to the southeast and viewed the concrete and brick pile area from the southwest, as seen in previous two inspections with no apparent change (photo 6). Next I walked about twenty-five yards to the southeast and observed the south side of the concrete and brick pile area where painted brick was observed in a pile; the area was as in the previous two inspections with no apparent change (photo 7). Finally, I walked around the east side of the southernmost pile of concrete around twenty-five yards for a view of the concrete and brick pile area as seen in previous two inspections still with no apparent change; I observed metal and dimensional lumber on the south side of this pile (photo 8). After completing my inspection of the site, I exited to the northeast through the interior gated entrance and walked to my vehicle, for a total of about 275 yards, entered my vehicle and exited through the exterior, northeast gated entrance off of 19th Street. I left the site at 1:25 P.M.

Interviews-Louis Kim Niemeyer, owner of property

On February 28, 2012, I called Mr. Niemeyer on his cell phone at 217/962-0533. I noticed that there was a lot of background noise. I asked if I was speaking with Louis Niemeyer, and explained that I was Jennifer O'Hearn calling from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. He said yes. I said that I inspected the site in Mattoon with asphalt, brick and concrete piles. I asked what his plans were for the material. He said that he planned on using it to redo the parking lot with brick as a base and put blacktop on top of it. I asked when he planned on doing so if it might be done in the next year. He said yes that he has some money set aside for it, that he just has not had a chance to do it yet. I asked where the area would be paved and he said he was going to make a road to where they are storing the black dirt and topsoil and make a landing to turn around on. He said that he also planned on putting some back on the west end of the asphalt area where it is low. I asked if the blacktop that he was going to put on top of the brick was fresh new asphalt or the old reclaimed asphalt. He said the reclaimed asphalt payement. He then asked if he could call me back, because they were in the middle of tearing a building down. I said that I should mention that I think they want you to put new pavement over the brick not the old RAP. He said "oh" and asked if he could call me

back again. I said okay and he asked who he was talking to and I said Jennifer O'Hearn and he said, Jennifer, okay.

On March 2, 2012 Mr. Niemeyer called me back. He said that the person that was going to build the road and fill in his parking lot using the construction and demolition debris is Monte Swearingen. He asked me if I was familiar with Monte. I said that I am familiar with Duane and David Swearingen. Mr. Niemeyer said that Monte is Duane's brother and that he is a little different that his brother. I said that can happen in families. I said that the law states that 25% of reclaimed asphalt pavement and concrete must be used as fill or otherwise used every year and that it all would have to be gone at the end of four years. He said that the west end of the pile of asphalt part is gone. He said that both ends were used on the parking lot onsite. I asked what percent of the asphalt pile did he estimate had been used and he said probably 10-15%. He said that the concrete and brick had not been touched yet. He said that he was going to have Matchbox haul the concrete to Champaign to be recycled. He said that they don't haul it unless they are going to Champaign with an empty truck to pick something up in Champaign. He said that they would bring a load back later. I said that I was not sure how the recyclers worked, if you could leave it, or if you had to take your recycled concrete with you. I said that most of what is at the site now is clean construction and demolition debris, except for the painted brick on the south side of the concrete and brick pile on the south side of the concrete and brick area. I said that on the south side of the large brick pile on the north side of the concrete and brick area, there was metal and dimensional lumber observed in the pile. I said that it did not look like any new material had been brought into the site since the earlier inspections. He said no that he learned his lesson and has not brought any more into the site. He said that if anything new had been brought in it would have had to been someone sneaking into the site and dumping it. I said hopefully the fact that most of the material is clean and that some of the asphalt pile has been used will keep my boss happy for now.

In summary, no waste has been removed from the site since the previous inspection. Remaining at the site is an asphalt pile at the north end of the property estimated at 200 cubic yards in size. In the second interview with Mr. Niemeyer he stated that 10-15 % of the asphalt had already been used to fill in the low, west end of the parking lot on which it sits. This would amount to around 25 yards of the original estimated 225 cubic yards of asphalt. Also remaining at the site is concrete and brick piles in the west, central portion of the site estimated at about 185 cubic yards in size. A total of about 385 cubic yards of apparent mostly clean, demolition debris with a little bit of painted brick, metal and dimensional lumber, remains at the site.

As a reminder, according to Section 3.160 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, "
To the extent allowed by federal law, clean construction or demolition debris shall not be considered "waste" if it is (i) used as fill material outside of a setback zone if the fill is placed no higher than the highest point of elevation existing prior to the filling immediately adjacent to the fill area, and if covered by sufficient uncontaminated soil to support vegetation within 30 days of the completion of filling or if covered by a road or




