

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Garrison Gross during the course of the March 1, 2012 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondent caused or allowed water to accumulate in used or waste tires, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2010).
- (2) That Respondent failed to collect a fee required under Section 55.8, a violation of Section 55(k)(2) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(2) (2010).
- (3) That Respondent failed to file a return required under Section 55.10, a violation of Section 55(k)(3) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(3) (2010).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2010), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00). If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty

specified above shall be due and payable no later than May 15, 2012, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2010), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS
ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2010). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

Subject: Tire Storage-Exempt Site Inspection at Croslow's Auto Repair

General Remarks: A Tire Storage-Exempt Site Inspection was conducted on Thursday, March 1, 2012 at Croslow's Auto Repair f/k/a Croslow's Shell Station. The inspection was conducted by Garrison Gross representing the Illinois EPA Bureau of Land. The site is located at the northeast corner of 15th Street and Lexington Avenue. The address is 1421 Lexington Avenue, Lawrenceville, Illinois 62439. The inspection was performed as a follow up to a telephone complaint (C-12-011-M). Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were clear skies, 50° F, with a moderate breeze. Surface conditions were damp.

Inspection Findings: The inspection began at approximately 11:35 a.m. Tires were observed near the front of the business. "New & Used Tires" appeared on the front of the business. One photograph was taken from the vehicle as I was parking (photo 001). I entered the business and asked to speak to the owner or manager. I identified myself and explained that the business had failed to notify as a retail tire facility. John Croslow identified himself as the owner of the business. I asked Mr. Croslow if he sold tires. Mr. Croslow stated that he sold new and used tires. He said he did not sell them very often but commented that he sold six (6) or so a month. He also stated that he might not sell any for several months.

Mr. Croslow was asked about tire disposal. He stated that he tried not to keep any waste tires onsite but he said he hauled them off when they accumulated. He stated that he hauled his tires to Davis Tire in Lawrenceville. Mr. Croslow stated that a guy used to come by and pick them up. He couldn't remember the name of the business or where the hauler was from. I asked him if he had any tire disposal receipts. He was unable to provide any receipts.

I continued the inspection by walking and photographing the site. Mr. Croslow did not accompany me. Twenty three (23) resalable used tires were observed north of the business. The tires were stored outside; some were on the ground, others were on a tire rack (photo 002). Some of the tires had accumulated water and contained organic matter (photo 003). Fifteen (15) waste tires were observed at the northwest corner of the building (photo 004). Approximately forty (40) resalable used tires were stored inside the business (photo 005). One (1) empty 55 gallon drum was stored outside near the tires (photo 006). The drum was not labeled. Two (2) 300-gallon storage tanks were located on the east side of the business. The storage tanks were not labeled.

I went back inside and spoke to Mr. Croslow. I explained that the used and waste tires should not be allowed to accumulate water. I asked to see a sales receipt and a recent ST-8 to verify the collection of the tire user fee for the Illinois Department of Revenue. Mr. Croslow stated that he had recently sold some tires but was unable to locate the receipt. He said his record keeping wasn't what it should be. A receipt booklet was used for transactions and did not include a preprinted line item for the tire user fee. Mr. Croslow stated that he was aware that the tire user fee was required to be collected for the sale of new and used tires. The recycle notice was not posted at the sales area as required. I informed him that he was required to accept waste tires whenever new tires were sold. I provided him with a recycle notice. I told him that he was allowed to charge a disposal fee for any waste tires that he accepted. Approximately 80 used / waste tires were located at the site. Based on

the conditions at the time of the inspection, the facility should be regulated as a tire storage-exempt facility. I provided him with a Used / Waste Tire Activity Notification & Registration Form.

Mr. Croslow was asked about the two 300 gallon storage tanks and the 55 gallon drum. He told me that the 300 gallon tanks were used oil storage tanks. He said the 55 gallon drum was for used antifreeze. I provided a tire recycle notice and two "Used Oil" stickers for the storage tanks. I also provided him with a Used / Waste Tire Activity Notification & Registration Form. I asked for records concerning the disposal of used oil and used antifreeze. Mr. Croslow was unable to locate any disposal receipts. He located a notebook and informed me that R & S Waste Oil (Telephone # 708-935-6109) had removed the waste oil in the past.

At the end of the inspection, I asked Mr. Croslow if he owned any property south of Bridgeport. He said his mother owned a farm down there but his brother Jerry was in charge of it. I asked him if he had burned any tires at the property. He said he hadn't burned any in a while. He said he stopped burning them because he knew it was illegal. Mr. Croslow stated that someone had told him that I had been down at the farm. I informed Mr. Croslow that the facility would be receiving a letter from the Agency in the near future. I also informed him that his mother and brother would be receiving a letter for the violations discovered at the farm. The inspection ended at approximately 11:50 a.m.

Additional Remarks: Immediately following the inspection at Croslow's Auto Repair, I drove to Neal Tire & Auto Service f/k/a Davis Tire & Auto Center. At approximately 11:55 a.m., I stopped by their facility to conduct a record review. I spoke to Steve Pointon, Manager. I inquired if Croslow's Auto Repair had disposed of used / waste tires at their facility. Mr. Pointon said Neal Tire had not disposed of any waste tires for Mr. Croslow. He said Mr. Croslow would have been given a receipt if he had delivered used / waste tires to their business. I thanked him for his information and left the business at 12:00 p.m.

Information concerning property ownership / control was obtained through tax records available from the Supervisor of Assessment's Office in Lawrence County. Tax bills are mailed to John & Phyllis Jean Dersch, P.O. Box 217, Mt. Carmel, Illinois 62863. The property is referred to as parcel # 06-002-022-00.

According to Agency files, a standardized letter was mailed to Croslow's Shell Station on March 11, 1994. The letter informed the facility that new regulations regarding the storage and disposal of used / waste tires had gone into effect on January 1, 1992. Agency records indicate that the facility has not notified as a tire retail facility. Information obtained from the Illinois Department of Revenue indicates that John K. Croslow's ST-8 status was changed to inactive in 1995.

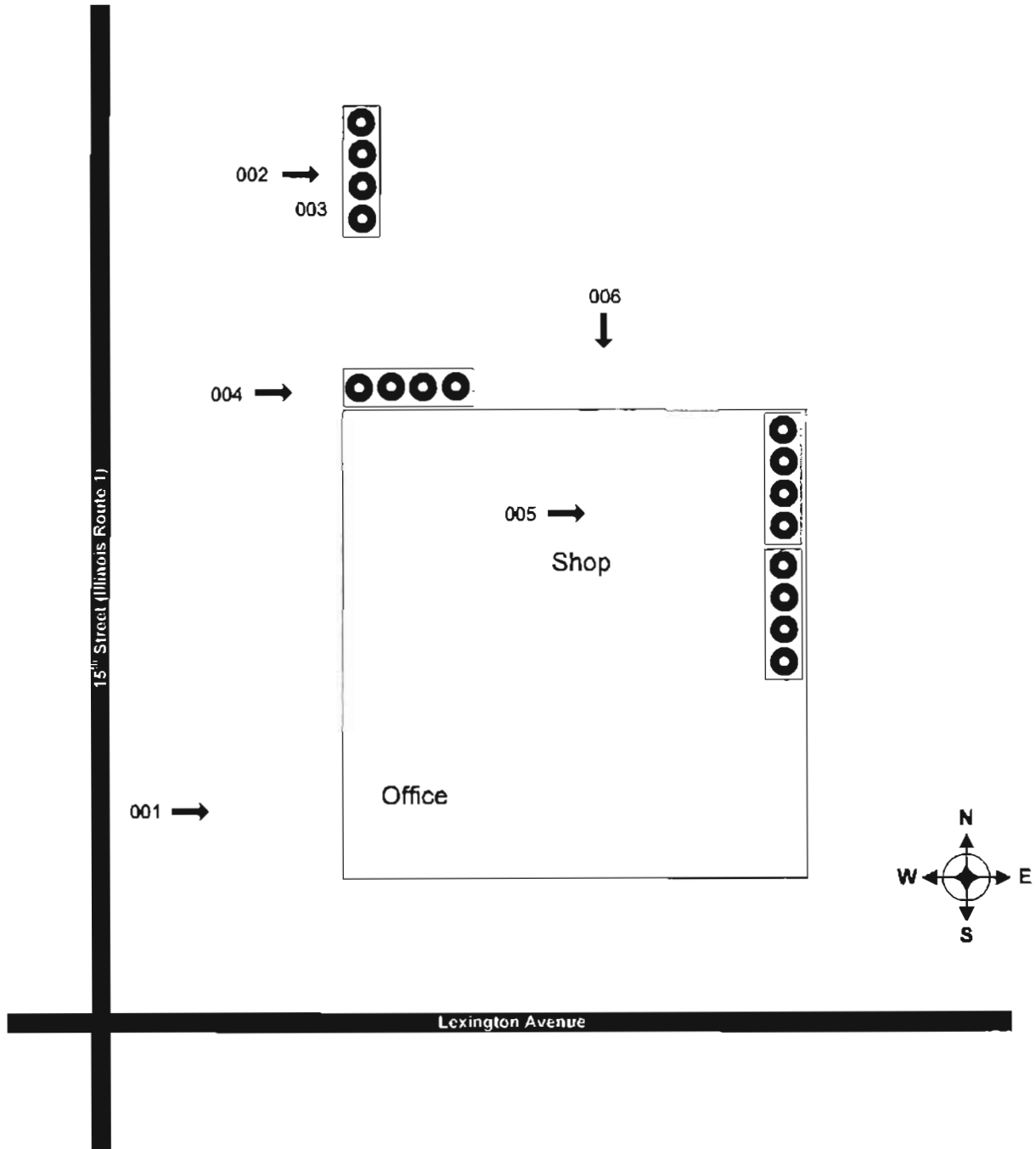

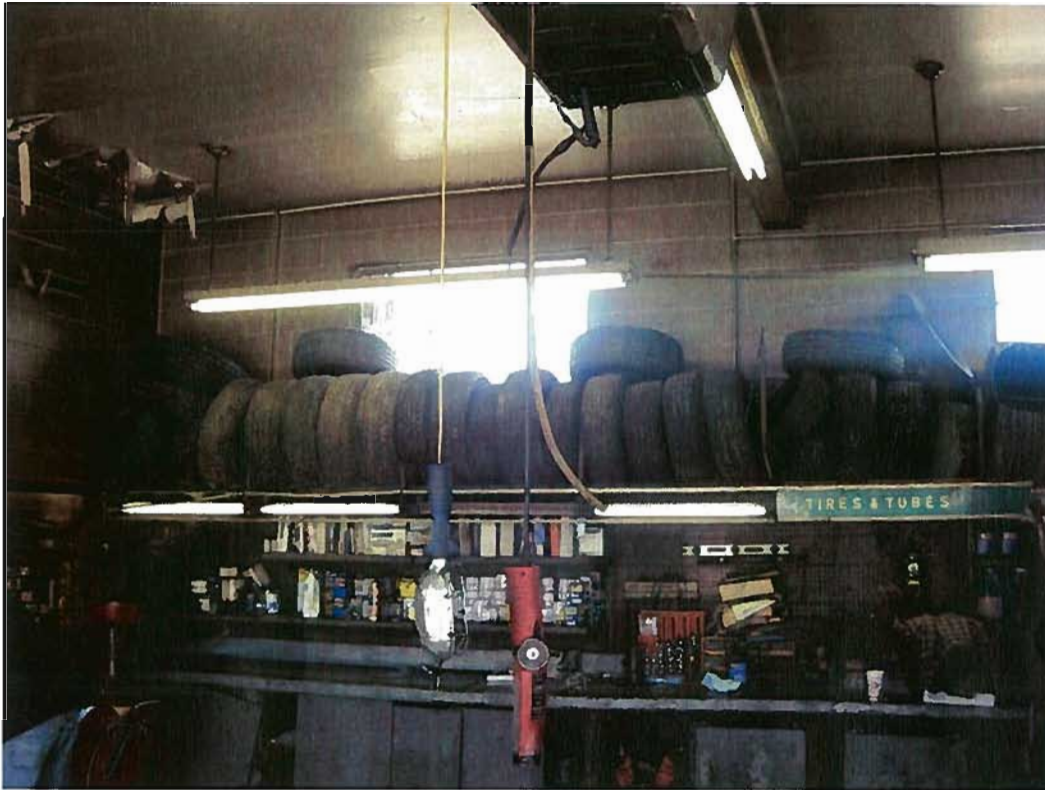


