1 HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: Good morning.  
2 My name is Cathleen Crowley, and I'm the assigned  
3 hearing officer in this proceeding. This is the  
4 third and last presently scheduled hearing being  
5 conducted by the Illinois Pollution Control Board  
6 in the matter of In the Matter of: Triennial  
7 Review of Water Quality Standards for Boron,  
8 Fluoride and Manganese: Amendments to 35 Ill.  
9 Adm. Code 302, Subparts B, C, E, F and 303.312,  
10 Docket R11-18.

11 As we will talk about a little  
12 more in detail later, the primary purpose of the  
13 hearing today is to satisfy the requirements of  
14 Section 27(b) of the Environmental Protection Act  
15 and additionally, we hope to complete receipt of  
16 any other testimony on the merits and economic  
17 impact of the Illinois EPA's December 2, 2010,  
18 regulatory proposal.

19 I note for the record that  
20 the persons in the room today are either  
21 affiliated with the Board, the Illinois  
22 Environmental Regulatory Group or the Illinois  
23 Environmental Protection Agency. So we will  
24 dispense with some of the usual opening remarks

1 about how we conduct our hearings, but I would  
2 like to introduce those present from the Board.

3 Seated to my immediate right  
4 is Board Member Carrie Zalewski, who is the Board  
5 member assigned to this proceeding. Seated  
6 to her immediate right is Deanna Glosser, also  
7 a Board member. Seated to my immediate left is  
8 Jennifer Burke, Board member. Seated to her left  
9 is Chairman Thomas Holbrook.

10 At this point I would ask for the  
11 Agency and other appearances, please.

12 MS. WILLIAMS: My name is Deborah  
13 Williams and I am appearing on behalf of the  
14 Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

15 MR. DAVIS: Good morning. My name  
16 is Alec Davis and I represent the Illinois  
17 Environmental Regulatory Group.

18 MR. MESSINA: And I am Alec  
19 Messina, the executive director for the Illinois  
20 Environmental Regulatory Group.

21 HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: There are a  
22 couple of things we need to put in the record before  
23 we hear from the participants.

24 The Board adopted its first notice

1 opinion and order in this document on March 15th.  
2 First notice of the proposed rules appeared on  
3 April 13, 2012, in 36 Illinois Register Page 5713.  
4 The 45-day first notice comment period expired on  
5 May 29th. Only two comments were filed since that  
6 publication.

7                   On May 29th, the Illinois  
8 Environmental Regulatory Group filed Public Comment  
9 No. 6 requesting elimination of proposed changes  
10 to Section 302.208. Based on concerns that those  
11 comments could be misconstrued, IERG will be  
12 speaking to that shortly.

13                   On May 30th, the Illinois EPA  
14 filed Public Comment No. 7. The Agency stated it  
15 had no objection to the changes IERG requested and  
16 made some additional suggestions of its own. We  
17 will discuss the substance of those comments right  
18 after we deal with the primary purpose of today's  
19 business.

20                   On April 26th, the Joint  
21 Committee on Administrative Rules requested the  
22 Board to provide an analysis of the economic and  
23 budgetary effects of this rulemaking along with  
24 any second notice proposal. This is a common

1 request in Board rulemaking proceedings.

2 On June 27th, the chairman  
3 submitted a written request to the Department  
4 of Commerce and Economic Opportunity known as  
5 DCEO that it perform an economic impact study,  
6 or EcIS, as provided for in Section 27 of the  
7 Environmental Protection Act. The Board requested  
8 that DCEO provide any response to the request on  
9 or about August 1st.

10 On August 2nd, DCEO's director,  
11 David Vaught, replied in pertinent part that "At  
12 this time, the department is unable to undertake  
13 such an economic impact study. Therefore, I must  
14 respectfully decline your request." The August  
15 2nd DCEO letter has been available on the Board's  
16 website since August 2nd giving the public the  
17 required 21-day notice of the DCEO decision.

18 Section 27(b) requires the Board  
19 to hold a hearing on the economic impact of the  
20 rules, any EcIS submitted, and any explanation DCEO  
21 provides for not conducting an EcIS. Section 27(b)  
22 allows the Board to dovetail the economic impact  
23 hearing allowing impact with any other hearing and  
24 this is one of those dovetail hearings.

1           Okay. Does anyone have anything  
2 they would like to say about the economic impact  
3 study submittal from DCEO?

4           Looking around, I see heads are  
5 shaking no. So we can then proceed. There was no  
6 pre-filed testimony for this hearing, but we learned  
7 this morning that IERG would like to address it's  
8 Public Comment No. 6. So I will ask Mr. Davis if  
9 he will present Mr. Messina.

10           MR. DAVIS: Yes. I have with me today,  
11 Mr. Messina, our executive director of IERG. I  
12 would ask actually that he be sworn in to provide  
13 his testimony.

14           HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: All right.  
15 Please do.

16   (Witness sworn.)

17           MR. MESSINA: Good morning and thank  
18 you. My name is Alec Messina and I am the executive  
19 director of IERG. My testimony is intended to  
20 provide the Illinois Pollution Control Board with  
21 what information it may require to understand IERG's  
22 position on the Board's first notice proposal.

23   First, let me please apologize  
24 for not bringing our concern to the Board during



1 the pre-first notice proceedings. Further, I  
2 appreciate being given the opportunity to raise  
3 an issue at this hearing today.

4 IERG supports the amendments  
5 to the Board's boron, fluoride and manganese  
6 standards. A number of IERG members have actively  
7 participated in this rulemaking and the amendments  
8 are generally thought to be beneficial to the  
9 regulated community as a whole. IERG encourages  
10 the Board to finalize the proposed amendments to  
11 the water quality standards as expeditiously as  
12 possible.

13 As noted in the comments we  
14 filed on May 29, 2012, IERG is aware that the  
15 proposed changes contained in Section 302.208,  
16 Subsections A, B, C and D were intended to simply  
17 clarify existing language, but we are concerned  
18 that those changes have the potential to be  
19 misconstrued. IERG's comments included language  
20 that IERG believes would leave the rules  
21 substantively unchanged.

22 IERG has met with the Agency  
23 to discuss its changes to the proposal, which  
24 were included in our Attachment A to the May 29th

1 comments and the Agency has suggested to the  
2 Board that it include IERG's language in its  
3 second notice proposal.

4 To be very clear, IERG believes  
5 our proposed changes are very important and are  
6 necessary to ensure that there are no inadvertent  
7 changes made to Illinois' mixing regulations.

8 Further, IERG has reviewed the  
9 Agency's revised language for Section 302.208(a)  
10 and has no concern with the Board making the  
11 suggested change to its proposal.

12 On behalf of IERG, I thank the  
13 Board for the opportunity to appear before you  
14 today and for your consideration to this testimony.  
15 I would be pleased to answer any questions. Thank  
16 you.

17 HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: Do members  
18 have any questions?

19 I just have one. In  
20 Section 302.208(c), we're talking about added  
21 language that water in which the Agency has  
22 approved a mixing zone or in which mixing is  
23 allowed. Typically, we would add for those  
24 waters in which the Agency mixing zone in writing,

1 do you have any problem with that?

2 MR. DAVIS: No.

3 MR. MESSINA: No.

4 HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: IERG has  
5 no problem. And Ms. Williams you can consider  
6 that and --

7 MR. DAVIS: In writing? That's the  
8 suggestion? Can you explain in a little more  
9 detail, what you mean?

10 HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: I'm sorry.  
11 I didn't quite catch what you said.

12 MS. WILLIAMS: Can you explain what you  
13 mean by in writing?

14 HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: Rather than  
15 in for which the Agency has approved a mixing zone  
16 in writing, it could be a permanent -- it could be  
17 a -- whatever, Something more than a phone call.

18 MR. DAVIS: I believe that 302.102  
19 requires mixing zones to be contained in writing  
20 memo, is that -- am I mistaken in my recollection?

21 MS. WILLIAMS: I mean, we may need  
22 to respond to this in writing afterward. I  
23 think mixing zones -- I don't want to testify.  
24 I would rather not testify, but the issue is a

1 little complex about whether it's going to be  
2 in a permit or whether it might be in a memo  
3 in a file that might not necessarily be sent out  
4 in a letter. It might not be desirable to the  
5 regulated community or the Agency to limit it in  
6 that way.

7 HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: That is what  
8 I was trying suggest. If you would like to address  
9 it in final comments, that is perfectly appropriate.  
10 I didn't want to put you on the spot.

11 MS. WILLIAMS: That's okay. I think  
12 that would be appropriate. We will consider that  
13 and give the Board some guidance in our final  
14 comment.

15 HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: Thank you.

16 If there are no other questions,  
17 then we will say thank you to Mr. Messina. We  
18 appreciate your speaking to us today.

19 Is there anyone else who wants  
20 to say anything else at all about this rulemaking?  
21 There does not appear to be so we get to the what  
22 happens next part of this proceeding.

23 We need to set a date for the  
24 closing of post-hearing comments. Following

1 the close of the comment period, the Board will  
2 make a decision as to whether and how this  
3 proposal will proceed as you all know.

4                   Transcripts are typically due  
5 at the Board by the eighth business day after  
6 the hearing. Here, that would be Tuesday,  
7 September 4th. Standard 14-day due date would  
8 be Tuesday, September 18th. We will go off the  
9 record in a minute to discuss whether this is  
10 a feasible date. The first feasible Board meeting  
11 date for this would be October 4th and 20th. After  
12 that, then we are aware that we would like to have  
13 this proceeding close. If we could go off the  
14 record for a minute.

15   (Whereupon, a discussion  
16   was had off the record.)

17                   HEARING OFFICER CROWLEY: After some  
18 off-the-record discussion, we have set Tuesday,  
19 September 18th, as the close date for public comment  
20 so that the Board can expeditiously reach a second  
21 notice decision shortly thereafter.

22   If there is nothing from anyone  
23 else here? Board members? No? Thank you very much  
24 then. I appreciate it.

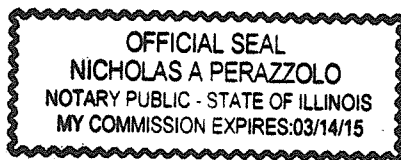
