
Years Later, Casa Central Receives Playground for Children in Humboldt Park

Consistent with such request, MWG also seeks a variance from, or amendments to, portions of the Board's order in Midwest. Generation, LLC - Waukegan Generating Station v. Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, PCB 12-121 (Aug. 23, 2012), in which the Board ordered MWG to comply with the system-wide emission rates for SO2 set forth in 35 III, Adm. Code 225.295(b).
