PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that, on December 17, 2012, Edison Mission Energy and certain of its subsidiaries and affiliates, including Respondent Midwest Generation, LLC, (collectively, the "<u>Debtors</u>")¹ filed voluntary petitions for relief under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "<u>Bankruptcy Code</u>") in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Northern District of Illinois (the "<u>Bankruptcy Court</u>").
