While granting the request will help the company deal with current financial constraints, the request also results in lower emissions than are currently required. Midwest Generation is a major provider of jobs in Illinois, both directly at its plants and indirectly through spending on supplies and services. Nearly 65 percent of its 850 employees are union members, and hundreds more men and women in the building and construction trades unions work in the plants on special contracting projects, often to install new pollution controls.

Midwest Generation has invested in environmental improvements since being established in 1999, sometimes even before new government requirements were in place. It operates its plants with the highest priority on safety for all workers at all times.

Midwest Generation is only seeking permission to reduce its rate of investment in new environmental controls for two years during a 12-year program of emissions reductions required by the State of Illinois.
