SPRINGFIELD COAL COMPANY, LLC'S, AND FREEMAN UNITED COAL MINING, CO., LLC'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO RESPOND TO THE INTERVENORS' DISCOVERY REQUESTS

Respondents Springfield Coal Company, LLC ("Springfield Coal") and Freeman United Coal Mining Co., LLC ("Freeman United") (collectively, "Respondents"), pursuant to 35 Ill.

Adm. Code 101.522, hereby file this Motion for Extension of Time to Respond to the Intervenors' Requests to Admit, Interrogatories, and Requests for Production of Documents to Springfield Coal and Freeman United ("Intervenors' Discovery Requests"). Respondents request an extension of time to respond to the Intervenors' Discovery Requests for thirty (30) days, until and including, Thursday, June 20, 2012. In support of this Motion, Springfield Coal and Freeman United state as follows:

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- On or around April 23, 2013, the Intervenors submitted the Intervenors'
 Discovery Requests to Springfield Coal.
- 2. On or around April 23, 2012, the Intervenors submitted the Intervenors' Discovery Requests to Freeman United.
- 3. Included in the Intervenors' Discovery Requests to Springfield Coal are thirteen (13) requests to admit (some with multiple subparts), twenty (20) interrogatories, and twenty-four (24) requests for production of documents.
- 4. Included in the Intervenors' Discovery Requests to Freeman United are three (3) requests to admit, fifteen (15) interrogatories, and twenty-one (21) requests for production of documents.
- 5. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.522 allows a party to obtain an extension of time for filing any document or doing any act which is required after giving notice to the opposing party and for good cause.
- 6. On May 1, 2013, Freeman United's counsel asked Intervenors' counsel for a thirty (30) day extension to respond to the Intervenors' Discovery Requests. On May 3, 2013, Intervenors' counsel denied Freeman United's request.
- 7. On May 3, 2013, Springfield Coal's counsel asked Intervenors' counsel for a thirty (30) day extension to respond to Intervenors' Discovery Requests. On May 6, 2013, Intervenor's counsel denied Springfield Coal's request.
- 8. In denying Respondents' request for the extension, Intervenors' counsel has asserted the following: "I am not comfortable allowing a 30-day extension on the discovery request. That puts us way too close to the hearing date (and I feel strongly that the hearing date

should not be delayed any further)." See Exhibit A, May 6, 2013 e-mail from J. Dexter to J. Kindschuh.

- 9. This litigation has been pending for approximately three years, during which time Intervenors have not previously submitted any discovery requests to Freeman United and only one previous discovery request to Springfield Coal. Intervenors served the current discovery requests on Freeman United and Springfield Coal approximately two months before the tentative date of the penalty hearing. Intervenors' own delay in serving discovery requests should not be used as the basis for their denial of an extension to respond.
- 10. Pursuant to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.522, Respondents have provided separate notice to the Intervenors regarding the request for a thirty (30) day extension.
- 11. A thirty (30) day extension will allow the Respondents to compile the necessary documents and to provide meaningful discovery responses to the Intervenors' Discovery Requests. Investigation into this matter is ongoing, and additional time is necessary to respond to the Intervenors' Discovery Requests.
- 12. A thirty (30) day extension will also allow for substantive settlement discussions to continue among the parties so that this matter may be amicably resolved.
- 13. The extension will not harm the Intervenors or any other party because, among other reasons, the Hearing Officer specifically stated during the status conference on March 11, 2013, that a tentative hearing date was scheduled for June 25, 2013. If necessary, this hearing date could be moved.
- 14. The Respondents' requested extension is not made for the purpose of undue delay, and will not prejudice the interests of any party to this case. At most, the parties may choose to postpone the hearing date to allow for additional time for discovery.

WHEREFORE, Respondents Springfield Coal and Freeman United respectfully request that the Illinois Pollution Control Board grant Respondents' request an extension of time to respond to the Intervenors' Discovery Requests for thirty (30) days, until and including, Thursday, June 20, 2012.
