Summary:

**Ms. Lymer (no spelling given) of Normal, Illinois did not make an inquiry.**

Response  
Summary:

**No response was given or required as Ms. Lymer made no inquiry. Rather, she left a voicemail message referring to the pending Clinton Landfill permit appeal (Clinton Landfill, Inc. v. IEPA, PCB 15-60). She wanted to be "put on record" as being opposed to Clinton Landfill accepting "toxic waste" for disposal. She stated the following: 1) people in Chicago, Peoria, and elsewhere (who would send their "toxic waste" to Clinton Landfill) won't drink the aquifer water, but we "downstaters" will, we "vote no" 2) one owner/operator of a "dump" does not have the right to even potentially poison the water used by over one-half million people in 80 communities, as well as by farms and other ventures and 3) "our EPA in Illinois should be protecting our water," "look what happened in California-they're begging for aquifers to be filled, we have aquifers." Finally, Ms. Lymer added that "when they talk about fracking, they need to be checking what chemicals they're going to be putting into the groundwater as well." This memorandum of Ms. Lymer's communication will placed into the record of PCB 15-60 in accordance with the Board ex parte procedural rules.**
