

Board Sends to Second Notice a Proposal to Amend TACO Rules Used in Site Remediation Projects

On December 7, 2006, the Illinois Pollution Control Board proposed amendments to the Tiered Approach to Corrective Action Objectives (TACO) for second-notice review by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules. TACO is set forth in Part 742 of Title 35 of the Illinois Administrative Code (35 Ill. Adm. Code 742). The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, on September 30, 2005, initiated this rulemaking by filing proposed amendments to the TACO rules. The rulemaking is docketed as In the Matter of: Proposed Amendments to Tiered Approach to Corrective Action Objectives (35 Ill. Adm. Code 742), R06-10.

Generally, the TACO rules provide methods for developing risk-based remediation objectives to be used in environmental contamination cleanups under several regulatory programs: Site Remediation Program (SRP), Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) Program, and Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Part B Permits and Closures.

The proposed second-notice amendments are primarily designed to update standards and improve procedures under TACO and make numerous corrections and clarifications. Changes include the addition of background soil levels for polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), newly applicable residential remediation objectives to protect construction workers, and enhanced flexibility in using ordinances for excluding the groundwater ingestion exposure pathway, as well as mandatory forms to be used for certain institutional controls.

Since publication of the proposed first-notice amendments in the *Illinois Register* on September 29, 2006 (30 Ill. Reg. 15366), the Board received no additional public comments. At second notice, the Board made only minor, non-substantive changes to the first-notice proposal.
