## B oard Adds Definitions to Used Oil M anagement Standards and to Special W aste Regulations

On October 21, 2010, the Pollution Control B oard adopted definitions relating to used oil management in the rulemaking docket designated In the M atter of: Proposed A mendments to the Board's Special W aste Regulations Concerning U sed Oil, 35 III. Adm. Code 739, 808, 809 (R06-20(B )). The B oard adopted one definition in its used oil management standards and three definitions in its special waste regulations.
In the second-notice opinion and order for docket (A), the B oard noted that, during the first-notice comment period, the Illinois Environmental Protection A gency (IEPA) and NORA, formerly known as the National Oil Recycling A ssociation, had addressed adding definitions, which had not been included in the first-notice proposal. On December 17, 2009, the B oard opened subdocket B in order to provide first notice publication of proposed definitions.
In docket (A) on February 18, 2010, the Board adopted amendments exempting from the manifesting requirement of Parts 808 and 809 both used oil defined by and managed in accordance with Part 739 and specific mixtures of used oil and other materials. With regard to those specific mixtures, the B oard adopted amendments to the Part 739 tracking requirements to include information required by a manifest.
At its meeting on October 19, 2010 the J oint Committee on A dministrative Rules considered the B oard's proposal and issued its certificate of no objection.

The B oard directed the Clerk of the B oard to file the adopted rule with the Secretary of State for publication in the Illinois Register.
