#### INTRODUCTION

This report covers activities of the Pollution Control Board for the fiscal year from July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977. Data on various aspects of the Board's operations are included for the entire seven years of the Board's existence since July 1, 1970.

Last year's report described the existence and function of the three agencies which in Illinois address environmental problems Statewide. Briefly, the Pollution Control Board has the rulemaking (quasi-legislative) and adjudicatory (quasi-judicial) functions. It covers all traditional fields of pollution control such as air, water, land, water supply, and noise, unless specifically pre-empted by Federal law. The Board has five fulltime Board Members and a staff of 19 persons. Board Members may not engage in any other endeavor except that considered proper for a judge (writing, lecturing, or teaching).

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has 596 employees. It performs monitoring and surveillance and does field investigations of pollution problems. The Agency initiates enforcement cases before the Board using the legal staff of the Attorney General. By statute, it is a party in all variance cases.

The third agency is the Institute for Environmental Quality. It was created to give attention to longer range problems. By being separate it can engage in applied research on Illinois problems where solutions are needed. It has a staff of 14. Most of its work is done by contract with universities, consulting firms or other State agencies. By statute it must prepare economic impact studies for all regulations proposed to the Board.

The Illinois Environmental Protection Act gives the full range of responsibilities and functions for each of the above mentioned agencies. Copies of the Act are available free of charge upon request to the Board.

#### BOARD PERSONNEL

At the end of the fiscal year, Mr. Nels E. Werner of Chicago, a graduate mechanical engineer, was appointed to the Board for a 3-year term ending June 30, 1980. He replaced Mr. Philip Zeitlin of Chicago who returned to his professional practice as a city planner.

#### REGULATORY ACTIVITY

The Board took final action on eleven regulatory proposals in FY77. On September 30, 1976 it adopted R75-15 which extended deadlines for combined sewer overflow control if the project is eligible for Federal funds and has pursued all necessary actions for grants in a timely fashion.

A Board-initiated proposal, R76-2 to determine the suitability of a proposed Cook County landfill site, was dismissed because of Agency issuance of a permit. On December 16, 1976 a revision to the Board Procedural Rules, R75-1 was adopted. The Board periodically reviews its Procedural Rules in the light of experience in using them and to take into account new court decisions and legislation. Proponents of R75-12, a proposal to change allowable sulfur content of fuel-oil in Cook County withdrew it.

Governor James R. Thompson asked the Board to relax for a 30-day period regulations dealing with the allowable sulfur content of residual fuel oil and to relax afterburner requirements because of severe winter weather and frozen rivers which prevented barge transport of petroleum products. The Board adopted this regulation, R77-2, on February 3, 1977.

Standards for total dissolved solids in effluents were relaxed for sources on the Mississippi River in R75-6 adopted March 3, 1977. The Board dismissed R77-1 which dealt with thermal standards for two Lake Michigan power plants by having the matter adjudicated in PCB77-82.

Noise levels for cars, trucks, motorcycles, etc. were set in R74-10 adopted May 12, 1977. The noise levels are measured 50 feet from the centerline of the lane of travel. The permissible noise levels are generally slightly looser than similar regulations long in effect in Chicago and Cook County. Enforcement of the regulation should bring a reduction in noise levels experienced by persons living near highways or those subjected to unmuffled or inadequately muffled vehicles.

The regulation for applying fish toxicants was enacted in R75-7 so that trash fish could be cleared preparatory to restocking by using a permit procedure instead of having to obtain a variance.

A revision to the Procedural Rules, R77-7, was adopted to lay out procedures for determinations of artificial cooling lakes thermal discharge acceptability. Another revision, R77-11, amplified this matter.

During FY77, a total of 17 economic impact studies were filed with the Board. Some of these studies were extremely helpful to the Board in making its decision. Other studies seemed inadequate or used questionable assumptions or simply could not generate relevant data. The Illinois use of these economic impact studies is being watched with interest by both the U. S. General Accounting Office and the Council on Environmental Quality. It is anticipated that the studies will become more even in quality as more experience is gained by all concerned.

A complete list of all Regulations filed before the Board since the last Annual Report appears in Appendix D. Regulations may be initiated by the Board, the Institute, or the Agency or by any person or group if 200 signatures are obtained. In addition, the signature requirement can be waived by the Board. Appendix C gives data on the types of Regulations filed before the Board by fiscal year since 1970.

#### CASE ACTIVITY

A further drop occurred in cases filed before the Board in FY77. Total cases filed numbered 317 compared to 436 for FY76. The drop was almost entirely in enforcement cases which decreased to 89 cases compared to 195 filed in the previous year. At the writing of this report, it appears that the drop in case activity has now bottomed out and will begin to increase.

Appendix A contains the listing of cases filed before the Board by types. Appendix B gives a comparison of "citizen enforcement" cases by type by fiscal years. Some 40 of these were filed in FY77 compared to 30 in FY76. The 208 "citizen" cases filed before the Board in its first seven full years of operation constitute 20.8% of the 1,002 enforcement cases the Board has received. A "citizen" case is defined as one filed by someone other than the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. The term includes cases filed by the Attorney General under his own powers in the name of the People of the State of Illinois.

The Board levied \$220,922 in penalties in 83 cases in FY77. A total of \$1,854,919.63 including interest assessed by judgment has been levied in 645 penalty cases by the Board in its history.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, in recent months, has asked all States to levy money penalties of such a size as to cancel any economic gains a proven polluter would have accrued by delaying compliance. Appendix F lists all penalties levied by the Board and their status.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL

The Board's expenditures for FY77 were \$574,900 compared to the appropriation of \$687,300. The expenditure figures are subject to final audit.

The appropriation for FY78 (under which the Board is operating at this writing) was significantly increased by the General Assembly in the hearing officer and court reporting items. The Board anticipated increased activity in regulatory hearings since economic impact studies are now being completed, thus requiring additional funds for preparation of transcripts. In addition, approval by the United States government of the Illinois request to issue National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits would put appeals of these permits with the Board, thus requiring more use of hearing officers.

#### THE COMING YEAR

The long-awaited Clean Air Act Amendments were enacted by the Congress and signed into law on August 7, 1977. Changes in the Federal Water Pollution Control Amendments of 1972 are expected during calendar year 1977. These and other revisions in the Nation's environmental laws have an effect and impact upon Illinois.

Board regulations may have to be revised to conform to Federal requirements if State control of certain functions is to continue and if Federal funds are not to be lost. Thus, it can be anticipated that the Board will be extremely busy in regulatory proceedings.

The anticipated approval for Illinois to administer the NPDES program; the quest for State "primacy" under the Safe Drinking Water Act; the need to revise the State Implementation Plans for air; the requirements of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act; and completion of "208" plans for non-point water pollution sources may generate activity before the Board.

Meeting these new requirements in a timely and judicious manner while keeping pace with older responsibilities will be the challenge of the coming year. The Board will do its best. Public comment and public participation are needed and welcome.

#### JUDICIAL REVIEW

During the past year there have been four appellate cases which dealt with the Board's power to grant or deny variances.

In Monsanto Company v. PCB, Ill.2d , 367 N.E.2d 684 (1977) the Illinois Supreme Court ruled that the Board was correct in its determination that it lacked authority to grant permanent variances. The Court found that the Environmental Protection Act was intended to be "technology forcing" and that permanent variances would run counter to this intention. The net result of this reasoning is that impossibility of compliance is not to be the controlling factor in deciding whether or not to grant a variance or in setting conditions for a variance. The Court went on to hold that when the Board sets conditions on a variance, it is exercising its quasi-legislative power and cannot be overturned unless its decision is arbitrary, capricious or unreasonable.

In Modine Manufacturing Co. v. PCB, 40 Ill. App. 3d 498, 351 N.E. 2d 875 (1976), the Second District Appellate Court upheld Procedural Rule 334 which provides that the Board may reconsider its final orders and affirmed the Board's conclusion that the stream which receives Modine's effluent should not be reclassified as secondary contact waters. The Board had held that a stream should not be reclassified when diversified aquatic biota exists even though it may be in an unstable environment due to low flow conditions.

In Material Service Corporation v. PCB, 41 Ill. App. 3d 192, 354 N.E. 2d 37 (1976), the Third District Appellate Court held that the Board could not deny a variance without giving the Petitioner the opportunity to present its case at a hearing.

In Caterpillar Tractor Company v. PCB, 48 Ill.App.3d 655, 363 N.E. 2d 419 (3rd Dist. 1977). the Third District Appellate Court ruled that the Board erred in denying Caterpillar a variance. The Court instructed the Board to follow the procedure it laid down in International Harvester Co. v. EPA PCB 75-271, in which a variance was granted even though the emissions in question contributed to a violation of ambient air quality standards. The Court also pointed out that the Board could not base its decision on data contained in an official State report which was published after the close of the hearing.

The Board's regulations on Regional Sewage Treatment and Stationary Noise Sources were also reviewed in the courts this past year.

In <u>Village of Lombard</u> v. <u>PCB</u>, 66 Ill.2d 503, 363 N.E.2d 814 (1977), the Illinois Supreme Court ruled that the Board lacked authority to promulgate regulations on regional sewage treatment. The Court held that the Environmental Protection Act did not intend

to involve the Board in the economics and politics of any county and that the Board could not force local governments to cooperate. Local governmental authority and funding obligations were held to be outside the area of the Board's expertise.

In Illinois State Chamber of Commerce v. PCB; Commonwealth Edison Co. v. PCB; and Association for Motor Sports of Illinois v. PCB, Ill.App.3d , 364 N.E. 2d 63l (1st Dist. 1977) the First District Appellate Court affirmed the Board's regulations on noise pollution from stationary sources. The Court followed the Supreme Court's opinion in Illinois Coal Operators Association v. PCB, 59 Ill. 2d 305, 319 N.E. 2d 782 (1974) and the Fifth District Appellate Court opinion in Shell Oil Co. v. PCB, 37 Ill. App. 3d 264, 346 N.E. 2d 212 (1976) in finding that the prohibition in Rule 102 against noise pollution which unreasonably interferes with the enjoyment of life or with any lawful business or activity or which violates the Board's standards was not beyond the Board's authority. A similar position was taken by the Third District Appellate Court in Union Oil Company of California v. PCB, 43 Ill. App. 3d 927, 357 N.E. 2d 715 (1976).

In Ferndale Heights Utilities Co. v. PCB, 44 Ill. App. 3d 962, 358 N.E. 2d, 224 (1976) the First District Appellate Court followed Illinois Coal Operators Association v. PCB and Shell Oil Co. v. PCB in upholding Rule 102 of the Noise Regulations and affirmed the Board's finding that respondent had violated Rule 102 by noise emissions from its pumping station, but reversed the assessment of a \$500 fine because it was not properly substantiated in the Board's Opinion and Order.

The Board's decision in two cases involving permit denial appeals were upheld by the courts.

In Springfield Sanitary District v. EPA, 48 Ill. App. 3d 784, 363 N.E. 2d 195 (1977) the Fourth District Appellate Court upheld the Board's order which affirmed the Agency's denial of a permit to install a pumping station. The Court approved of the Board's characterization of sewers by what they are designed to be (sanitary, combined or storm sewers) and not by the nature of the wastewater that flows through them. This distinction is important because it means that once a sanitary sewer is installed, it does not become a combined sewer by virtue of infiltration and wear and tear and cannot legally be allowed to overflow.

In Peabody Coal Company v. EPA, 49 Ill. App. 3d 252, 364 N.E. 2d 929 (1st Dist. 1977) the First District Appellate Court upheld the Board's decision dismissing Peabody's permit denial appeal. Three of the four counts of the appeal were dismissed for insufficiency and Peabody was given the right to refile. The Court held that this was not a denial of due process. The remaining count in Peabody's appeal dealt with the Agency's certification of a NPDES permit. The Court affirmed the Board's ruling that it lacked jurisdiction to review the Agency's action.

The greatest number of appellate cases this year dealt with enforcement matters. Three of these involved landfills.

In <u>Tri-County Landfill Co. v. PCB</u> 41 Ill. App. 3d 249, 353 N.E. 2d 316(1976) the Second District Appellate Court reviewed an enforcement order involving two landfill companies. The Court affirmed the Board's ruling that the prohibition against water pollution extended to private waters contained on the Respondents' property which flowed into underground aquifers. The Court upheld the Board's contention that it was not estopped from finding a violation simply because the Agency's predecessor had approved of the Respondents' operations. The Board's authority to enjoin operations which threaten to cause pollution was also confirmed. The Board's findings of violation were upheld but the penalties (\$10,000 for each landfill) were reversed along with the Board order that the Respondents forfeit \$20,000 each in the event that the discharges were not abated within 180 days.

In <u>City of Pekin v. EPA</u>, 47 Ill. App. 3d 187, 361 N.E. 2d 889 (1977) the Third District Appellate Court affirmed the Board's finding that there was a danger of leachate pollution from Pekin's landfill and that the landfill should be closed. The Court disallowed the Board's order which required the city to submit a closure plan because this remedy was not sought in the Agency's complaint.

In <u>Hindman</u> v. <u>PCB</u>, 42 Ill. App. 3d 766, 356 N.E. 2d 669 (1976) the Fifth District Appellate Court upheld the Board's decision that the owner of a landfill was responsible for any burning at the disposal site even though the fire was started by a third party. The amount of the Respondent's fines was reduced because he had not started the fire and because he had attempted to obtain a permit for operation of his landfill.

Eight cases were concerned with incidences of air pollution.

In Marblehead Lime Co v. PCB, 42 Ill. App. 3d ll6, 355 N.E. 2d 607 (1976) the First District Appellate Court affirmed the Board's finding that the Respondent had caused air pollution by its dust emissions and held that a \$20,000 fine was not excessive.

In <u>Hillside Stone Corporation v. PCB</u>, 43 Ill. App. 3d 158, 356 N.E. 2d 1098 (1976), the First District Appellate Court upheld the Board's finding that dust emissions from the Respondent's quarry constituted an unreasonable interference with the enjoyment of the neighbors' lives and property, but the Court reduced the fine from \$10,000 to \$2,000.

In Aluminum Coil Anodizing Corporation v. PCB, 40 Ill. App. 3d 785, 351 N.E. 2d 612 (1976) the Second District Appellate Court affirmed the Board's holding that the Respondent had caused air pollution by odor emissions. The Court also held that the Board's fine of \$1500 was not excessive.

In <u>Draper and Kramer, Inc.</u> v. <u>PCB</u>, 40 Ill. App. 3d 918, 353 N.E. 2d 106 (1976) the First District Appellate Court reversed the Board's holding that the Respondent had caused air pollution. The Court held that the evidence was insufficient to show that Respondent's emissions contained the contaminant mentioned in the Agency's complaint or that the contaminant caused discomfort, damage or unreasonable interference with the enjoyment of property. Consequently the \$1000 fine was also reversed.

In Wells Manufacturing Co. v. Citizens for a Better Environment, 48 Ill. App. 3d 337, 363 N.E. 2d 26 (1977), the First District Appellate Court reversed the Board's finding that Wells had caused air pollution through odor emissions and held that Wells was entitled to an operating permit. The Court felt that the Board did not adequately consider Well's good faith attempts at compliance or the fact that the complaining witnesses all moved into the area after Wells started operation.

In Lioyd A. Fry Roofing Co. v. PCB, 46 Ill. App. 3d 412, 361 N.3. 2d 23 (1977) the First District Appellate Court upheld the Board's ruling that Fry could be fined even though it had already come into compliance, but it reduced the amount of the fine from \$40,000 to \$10,000.

In <u>Bulk Terminals Company</u> v. <u>EPA</u>, 65 Ill. 2d 3l, 357 N.E. 2d 430 (1976), the Illinois Supreme Court reviewed a case in which the Respondent had already been fined by the City of Chicago for the same offense it was charged with in a proceeding before the PCB. The Court held that the Respondent could not obtain an injunction in circuit court against further proceedings before the Board until it had exhausted the administrative procedure before the Board and the Appellate Courts.

In Clean Air Coordinating Committee v. EPA, 42 Ill. App. 3d 124, 355 N.E. 2d 573 (1976) the First District Appellate Court dismissed an appeal filed by the Agency because it was filed one day before the Board had entered its final order after both parties had filed motions for reconsideration. The Board's order had found the Agency to be in violation by failing to call an ozone watch on August 9, 1974.

A complete list of Appellate Court decisions appears in Appendix G. The list is alphabetical and is categorized by type of proceeding, such as enforcement, variance, permit denial appeal, or review of a regulation.
