ORDER OF THE BOARD (by J.D. O'Leary):

The Board today directs Illinois Power Resources, LLC (Illinois Power Resources) and Ameren Energy Medina Valley Cogen, LLC (Medina Valley) to file a status report by January 18, 2016.

On April 9, 2013, Ameren Energy Resources filed on behalf of Ameren Energy Resources Generating, AmerenEnergy Generating Company, and Electric Energy, Inc. (collectively Ameren) a proposal to add a Subpart B to Part 840 of the Board's regulations. Part 840 addresses the closure of coal combustion waste surface impoundments. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 840. Ameren stated that the proposal is intended to allow it to close approximately 16 surface impoundments that manage coal combustion waste at eight coal-fired power plants it owns.

On July 1, 2013, Ameren filed a motion to stay proceedings (Mot.) that noted the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) intended to propose generally-applicable rules regulating closure of ash surface impoundments. On July 25, 2013, the Board granted the motion to stay for one year and directed Ameren to file quarterly status reports. The Board stated that the fourth status report could request an extension of the stay.

The Board received status reports on October 28, 2013; February 14, 2014; April 24, 2014; and July 23, 2014. The February 14, 2014 report stated that, in December 2013, Illinois Power Resources and Medina Valley "acquired ownership of, or indirect ownership interest in, the facilities that are the subject of this site-specific rulemaking." Illinois Power Resources and Medina Valley also noted that the Agency had filed a proposal for a generally-applicable rule. *See* Coal Combustion Waste (CCW) Ash Ponds and Surface Impoundments at Power Generating Facilities, R 14-10. In their July 23, 2014 status report, Illinois Power Resources and Medina Valley requested that the Board extend the stay for an additional year.

On August 7, 2014, the Board extended the stay for one year and directed Illinois Power Resources and Medina Valley to file quarterly status reports during the one-year extension. The Board stated that the fourth status report could request an extension of the stay. The Board received status reports on November 7, 2014, and February 10, 2015, both of which requested that the Board continue to maintain the stay. Since then, however, the Board has not received a third or fourth quarterly status report or any other filing from Illinois Power Resources or

Medina Valley. On November 5, 2015, the Board stayed consideration of R14-10, the proposal for generally applicable rules, for 120 days to March 4, 2016.

The Board directs Illinois Power Resources and Medina Valley to file a status report by Monday, January 18, 2016. In that status report, the Board directs Illinois Power Resources and Medina Valley to detail the progress of this proceeding. If Illinois Power Resources and Medina Valley request an extension of the stay, the Board directs them to describe any continued need for a stay. If the Board does not receive a status report by Monday, January 18, 2016, it may issue an order dismissing the rulemaking proposal and closing this docket.
