ROLL CALL

The Clerk of the Board called the roll. Four Board Members answered present.

Mix It Up: The ins and outs of allowed mixing under Part 302 of the Board's regulations –

Mr. Kruse and Ms. Liu provided a PowerPoint presentation on the regulatory and physical aspects of mixing in receiving streams under the Board's water pollution regulations. First, Mr. Kruse reviewed the requirements for and limits on mixing under Section 302.102 of the regulations for allowed mixing, mixing zones, and zones of initial dilution. Mr. Kruse explained the rule that compliance with the applicable water quality standard must be achieved at the edge of any permitted or allowed mixing. Ms. Liu then discussed the physical parameters and layout of mixing zones, including the 26-acre limit on such zones and the areas in which acute and chronic standards must be met. Ms. Liu also described various outfall designs that are used to achieve optimal mixing and rapid and immediate dispersion. Mr. Kruse concluded the presentation with an overview of mixing conditions in NPDES permits, which define the scope of mixing, and compliance-related matters. A copy of Mr. Kruse and Mrs. Liu's PowerPoint presentation is available upon request. The Board took no action on this matter.
