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THE ILLINOIS ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATORY GROUP'S PUBLIC COMMENTS

NOW COMES the ILLINOIS ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATORY GROUP ("IERG"), by and through its attorney, Antonette R. Palumbo, and in accordance with the March 3, 2016, Opinion and Order, hereby submits its First Notice comments in the above-captioned matter.

IERG is an Illinois non-profit corporation affiliated with the Illinois Chamber of Commerce. IERG is comprised of fifty-three (53) member companies that are regulated by governmental agencies that promulgate, enforce, or administer environmental laws, rules, regulations, or other policies. One of IERG's primary roles is to represent the interests of its members in rulemakings before the Illinois Pollution Control Board ("Board"). IERG appreciates the opportunity to participate in this proceeding and offers the following comments for consideration by the Board.

I. INTRODUCTION

IERG submits these comments in support of the comments filed by Dow Chemical Company ("Dow"). IERG does not intend to recite Dow's comments verbatim; rather, IERG supports the clarifications sought by Dow, as IERG understands that other states have encountered complications in implementing the federal amendments being adopted into Illinois' regulations in this rulemaking. IERG believes the public and the regulated community would be better served by Illinois regulations that clearly reflect some of the more confusing aspects of the federal rules.

To that end, IERG supports the clarifications sought by Dow in relation to four areas of the regulations, including: 1) the pre-2008 exclusions; 2) speculative accumulation; 3) the legitimacy factors analysis; and 4) the contained standard. IERG is also aware that some confusion about the proposed wording has arisen due to differing versions of the proposed regulations from the Board's March 3, 2016 proposal and the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules' ("JCAR") *First Notice Version for Use in Creating Second Notice Changes*. As such, IERG encourages the Board to ensure continuity between the two versions.

II. DISCUSSION

The pre-2008 exclusions and the interplay between these exclusions and the amendments to the regulations are thoroughly discussed by U.S. EPA in the *Federal Register* published on January 13, 2015. 80 FR 1696-20 (Jan. 13, 2015). In order to ensure complete clarification of the continued validity of the pre-2008 exclusions in relation to these amendments, IERG supports Dow's suggestion that the Board discuss these exclusions more thoroughly within its Opinion, or include a Board Note within the text of the rules. IERG understands that the phrase "pre-2008 exclusions" does not actually appear within the text of the rules. However, U.S. EPA stated that the amendments adopted do not alter or amend these exclusions, and this should be noted by the Board.

IERG also encourages the Board to adopt the suggestions Dow has made in regards to the provisions referring to speculative accumulation. IERG is aware that in other states, issues have arisen related to the labeling requirements and believes that Dow's comments seek to address these concerns and clarify the new requirement.

U.S. EPA also adopted amendments to the legitimate recycling determination factors.

IERG recommends the Board adopt the Board Notes suggested by Dow detailing the evaluation

requirements for the fourth factor of legitimacy and clarifying that facilities do not have to

proceed through the factor four steps in the order laid out in the rule. This clarification is

reflective of U.S. EPA's interpretation of the rule and will ensure proper application of the

legitimacy determination, as amended by U.S. EPA. 80 FR 1726-30 (Jan. 13, 2015).

Lastly, IERG suggests the Board adopt Dow's proposed actions regarding the contained

standard. The Board's deviation from the federal amendments in adding "unpermitted" before

"release" could result in the improper interpretation and application of this standard. U.S. EPA

noted that a single release event does not mitigate or suspend the application of the contained

standard. Rather, a release must be continuous or continuously intermittent in order for the

hazardous secondary material to no longer be contained. See 80 FR 1746 (Jan. 13, 2015). IERG

recommends the Board make this unambiguously clear by including a Board Note.
