I assume that you had nothing with regard to Part 722. Because you captioned it in the subject line but included no suggestions relating to the Part.

I have made five of the suggested corrections and revisions cited in your e-mail below, with the following exceptions:

724.171(a); 724.245(a), (b), (c), (d), (e) & (f); 724.933(a), (a)(2), (d), (d)(4) & (e); 724.933(a), (a)(2), (d), (d)(4) & (e); 724.935(a); 724.986(b), (c), (d) & (e); etc.: The Board retained the ending period for the topical subheadings at this time.

724.1102(a): The Board did not add a comma after "leachate."

In addition to the change from "Section 5.0 to" to "Section 5.0 of" in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 721.986(e)(2)(A), I corrected similar occurrences in Sections 724.982(c)(5)(C) and 724.986(e)(2)(A).

I continue with 35 Ill. Adm. Code 725.

I have attached the notice and Code texts of Part 724 as corrected for you to review to ensue I have captured all you have suggested, should you wish to do so.

Throughout: is it necessary to close self-standing but fragmentary subsection headings with periods? IAC style usually doesn't allow this unless the period is necessary to separate the heading from the text in an introductory paragraph. See, for instance:

724.171(a)

724.245(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f)

724.933(a), (a)(2), (d), (d)(4), (e)

724.935(a)

724.986(b), (c), (d), (e)

724.933(c): What did the Board decide about degree markings? Our understanding was that you were moving to 28 °C rather than 28° C (reflecting SI style), but this could be a mistaken impression. Please advise.

724.934(a): Does this sentence need a period?

724.936(b): Should there be a comma after "IF"?

724.1101(c)(4): Is there an extra period at the end of this subsection in your version?

724.1102(a), 4th line: Shouldn't there be a comma after "leachate" (whether or not there is a comma after "hazardous waste")?

724.1102(b), last line: Do you have an extra "of" in your version?

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
